

Encouraging Safe Walking and Bicycling to and from School Throughout New Jersey



2021 Summary of Technical Assistance supported by the New Jersey Safe Routes to School Program.

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Introduction

The NJ Safe Routes to School Resource Center (NJSRTS RC) is a partnership between the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) and the Alan M. Voorhees Transportation Center (VTC) which is housed within the Edward J Bloustein School of Planning and Public Policy at Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey. This partnership was established to provide services, training, coordination, and technical assistance directly to regional planning associations, organizations, and local and regional governments. In 2011, the capacity of the NJSRTS RC was expanded to form a partnership between NJDOT, the NJSRTS RC, and all eight of New Jersey's Transportation Management Associations (TMAs). NJDOT provides program administration and guidance through each of the TMA's SRTS Regional Coordinators, as well as provides federal funding through the Local Aid Grant program.

Working with the NJSRTS RC, SRTS Regional Coordinators from all eight TMAs are mobilized to proactively reach out to and partner with schools, local and regional governments, and other organizations from all 21 counties throughout New Jersey to provide a variety of SRTS non-infrastructure services such as programs and education and implement these events and programs to encourage students to walk and bike to school. The NJSRTS RC provides support by offering services, training, oversight, and technical assistance to all eight of NJ's TMAs.

The NJ Safe Routes to School Resource Center focuses on:

- Enhancing the capacity of Transportation Management Association (TMA) staff by providing training, guidance, support, discussion opportunities, and information sharing regarding the technical aspects of Safe Routes to School;
- Encouraging increased participation in education, encouragement, and enforcement activities throughout the state of New Jersey;
- Facilitating policy-level discussions to increase linkages between active transportation and public health; and
- Providing technical assistance directly to New Jersey communities and schools.

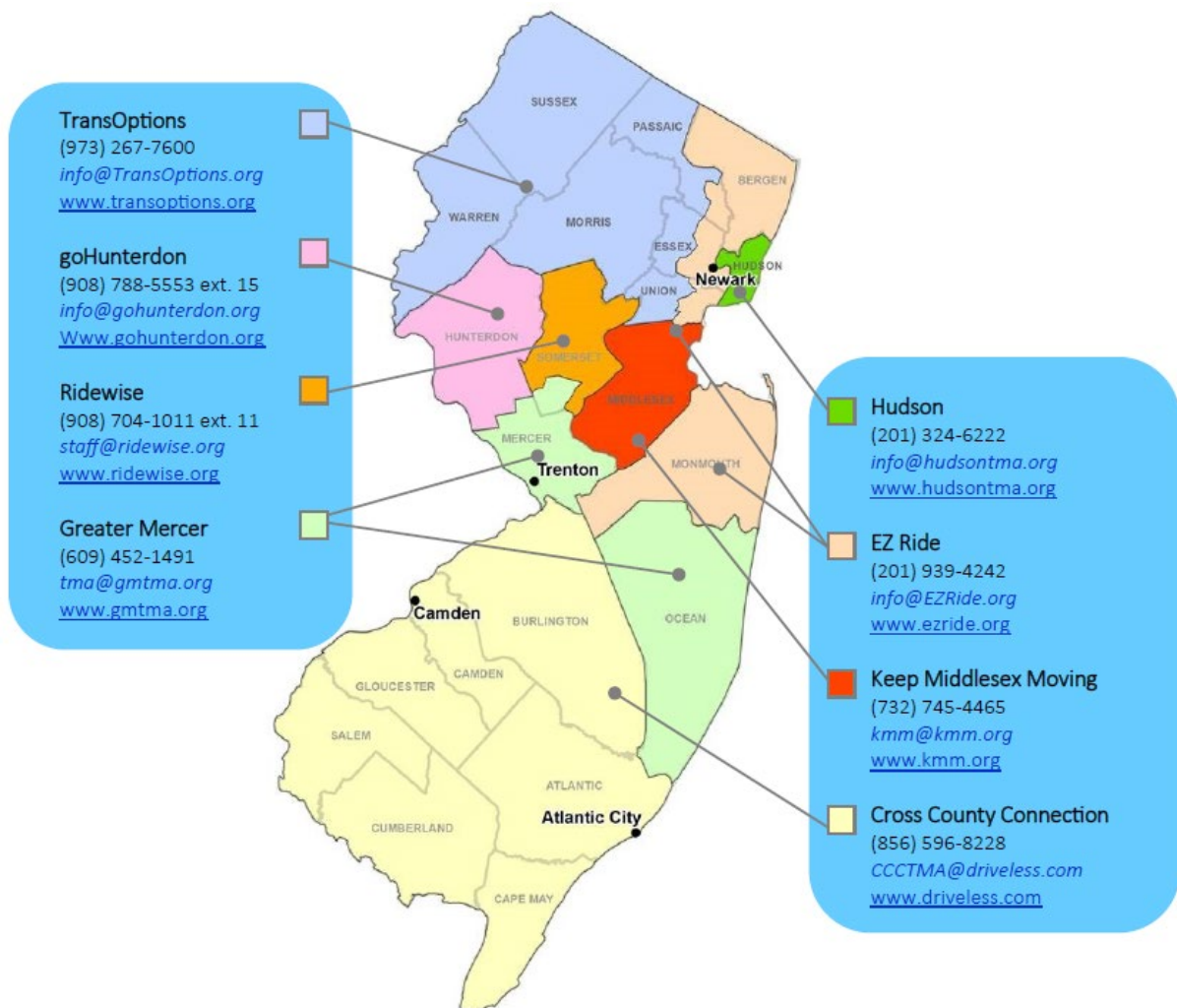
The year 2021 marked the tenth year of the enhanced non-infrastructure program managed through the NJSRTS RC, and the program continues to develop and expand. Working with the NJSRTS RC, the SRTS Regional Coordinators have significantly increased outreach levels across the state since the launch of the program in 2011, and they continue to make strides in project and program implementation, as reflected in this updated report.

1. Outreach Progress Reports

Outreach Progress Reports and maps were prepared both at the statewide level and for each TMA based upon information reported in the monthly Record of Contact January through December 2021. The reports detail how many and which communities the TMAs have contacted regarding SRTS programs as well as disadvantaged communities reached. Outreach reports have been generated for:

Overall Statewide Outreach for 2021

Outreach from the TMAs across New Jersey for 2021 (from January through December 2021) consisted of the following:

- TMAs made contact with 205 communities or 36% of the total communities in NJ of 564.
- The total number of disadvantaged communities contacted is 40 out of 96 disadvantaged communities in New Jersey.
- The total number of school districts contacted is 27.
- The total number of schools contacted is 321.
- The total number of municipal contacts is 107.
- The total number of contacts with other organizations is 50.
- Total outreach at all levels is 478.

Disadvantaged Community Maps

Seven of the eight TMAs serve areas, which include designated disadvantaged communities. These communities were identified as important outreach targets to encourage SRTS participation.

Regional Coordinators have been instructed to provide enhanced outreach efforts to disadvantaged communities in their service areas. The statewide maps show the disadvantaged communities reached and whether outreach levels were initial contacts or program implementation. The disadvantaged community maps indicate both disadvantaged communities contacted and not contacted by each TMA within each of their service areas in 2021.

Outreach and engagement with disadvantaged communities is prioritized in the SRTS program. The NJ SRTS RC uses the New Jersey Department of Education’s (NJ DOE) District Factor Group (DFG) designation based on a community’s approximate socioeconomic status. The DFG designations used in this report are from the 2000 decennial census, which is the most recent date they were updated. The following six variables which are closely related to socioeconomic status are used to calculate the DFGs:

1. Percent of adults with no high school diploma
2. Percent of adults with some college education
3. Occupational status
4. Unemployment rate
5. Percent of individuals in poverty
6. Median family income

Using these six variables, each municipality is given a score. This score may be weighted if some communities receive a significant share of students from other communities. Districts with similar scores are grouped into a DFG class. The eight DFG classes are A, B, CD, DE, FG, I, and J. Municipalities ranked A or B (the lowest DFG scores) are considered “Low Socioeconomic Communities” or “Disadvantaged Communities” for the purpose of the SRTS program.

Outreach Observations for each TMA

The outreach section of each TMA’s report is a summary for 2021 of:

- The total number and percentage of communities the TMA has reached during each year;
- The total number of contacts at the district, school, municipality, organization, other and total contacts at all levels each year;
- The total number of disadvantaged or low-socioeconomic status communities contacted in the service area, as well as the number and names of the disadvantaged or low-socioeconomic communities not contacted each year.

Table of Contacted Municipalities

The report shows a table listing the name of each municipality contacted by county and the type of entity contacted for 2021. Outreach has taken place at various levels in each community—school, school district, municipality, or other community organization. Disadvantaged communities are indicated with an asterisk.

Outreach Levels from January through December of 2021 for each TMA

The report displays a pie chart showing the assessed outreach at all levels (school, district, municipality and other organizations) for the months from January through December of 2021 which are detailed in the monthly Record of Contacts. Outreach is categorized into six classes: (1) Contact Made, (2) Preliminary Conversations, (3) Setting up a Program, (4) In the Process of Program

Implementation, (5) Ongoing Programming, and (6) Institutionalized Programming. Levels were self-reported by TMAs. Criteria for the level of outreach are detailed below:

1. Contact made
 - Contact key players (dialogue, email exchange, conference call)
 - Discuss what SRTS is and what TMAs can do to help
2. Preliminary conversations
 - Present to larger groups about SRTS
 - Discuss getting a Resolution of Support, setting up events, conducting surveys and tallies, School Travel Plans, etc.
3. Setting up a program
 - Establish a SRTS program by completing an enrollment form or memorandum of understanding, discussing dates for the event(s) and getting a Resolution of Support from local municipal government and local Board of Education (or equivalent body).
4. In the process of program implementation
 - Start annual traditions and build SRTS awareness
 - Identify a SRTS champion
 - Hold at least one SRTS program or event such as
 - Walk to school day
 - Bike clinic
 - School assembly
5. Ongoing programming
 - Get Sustainable Jersey, Sustainable Jersey for Schools and/or SRTS Recognition Program (Bronze, Silver, Gold) certified
 - 4 SRTS events planned
 - Create a School Travel Plan
 - Conduct SRTS student travel mode tally
 - Hold a multi-week program such as
 - Walking School Bus
 - Golden Sneaker program
 - Walking Wednesdays
 - Multi-day bike/pedestrian education
6. Institutionalized programming
 - SRTS program is part of the school identity and SRTS events implement with little to no involvement from the TMA.
 - Support from PTA, PTO, or Green Team and frequent and regularly scheduled programs (more than 4 on a weekly, monthly, and annual basis).

Pedestrian and Bicycle Events from January-December of 2021

The number of pedestrian and bicycle events taking place in the service area was tabulated in a table. Events include walking school bus, bike train, Walk to School Day, Bike to School Day, bike rodeo, and mileage clubs.

Education Events from January-December of 2021

The number of educational events was tabulated in a table. Examples include bike safety lessons, pedestrian safety lessons, and other related school assemblies.

Policy and Planning Activities from January-December of 2021

Encouraging bicycling and walking to school through policy and planning activities were also tabulated. Examples include walkability and bikeability assessments, School Travel Plans, supportive walk/bike policies, and support resolutions. Complete Street policies are only noted when TMA staff is involved in the process of passing a resolution.

Other Events from January-December of 2021

The number of other events was tabulated in a table. Examples include crossing guard appreciation, community presentations and other events not listed on the Record of Contact.

Outreach Level Maps for each TMA

Outreach level information for 2021 is represented on a map of each TMA's service area. This map shows the six outreach levels both for schools and municipalities. For TMAs that have disadvantaged communities, maps indicate disadvantaged communities contacted and the level of contact for 2021.

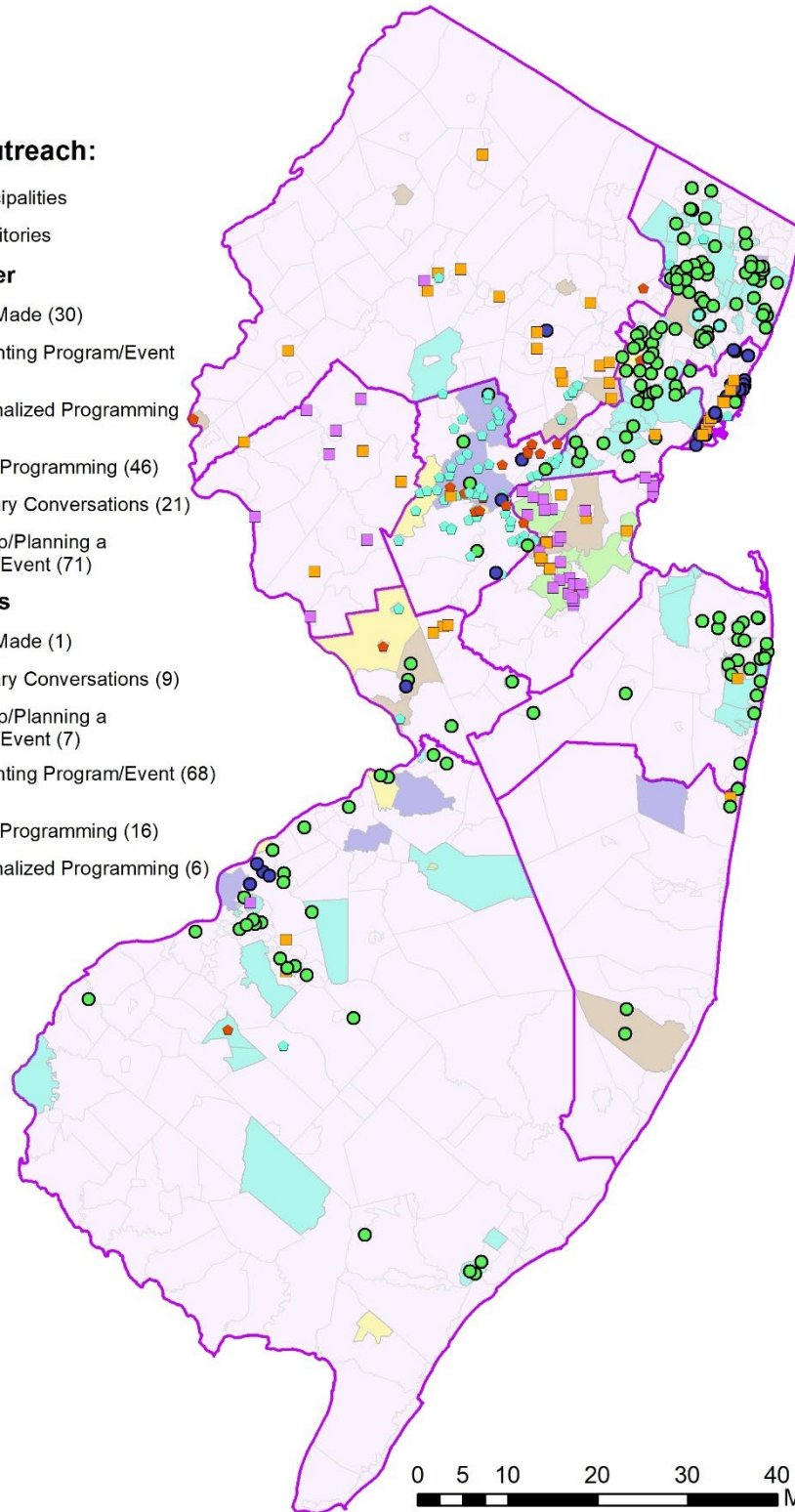

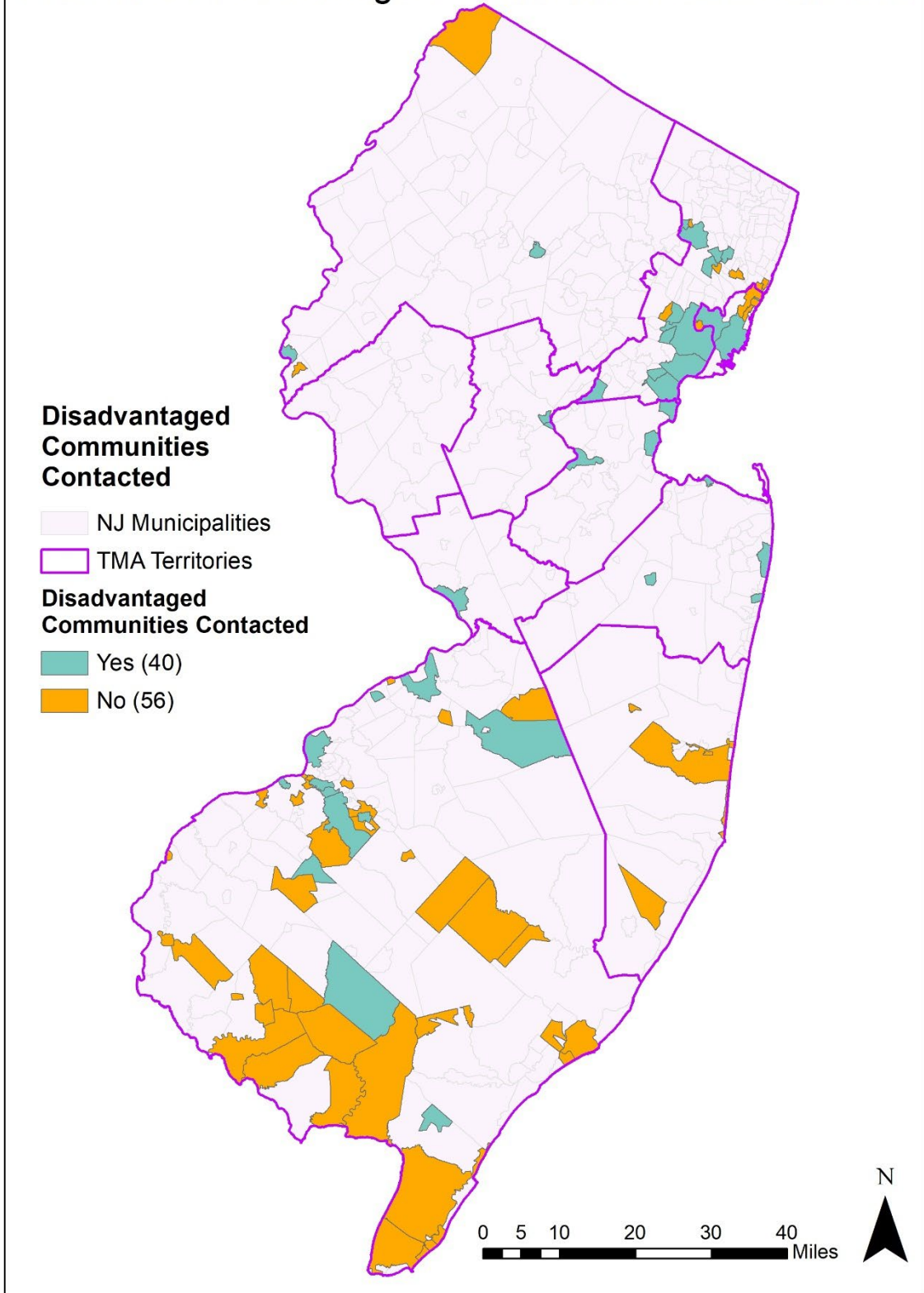

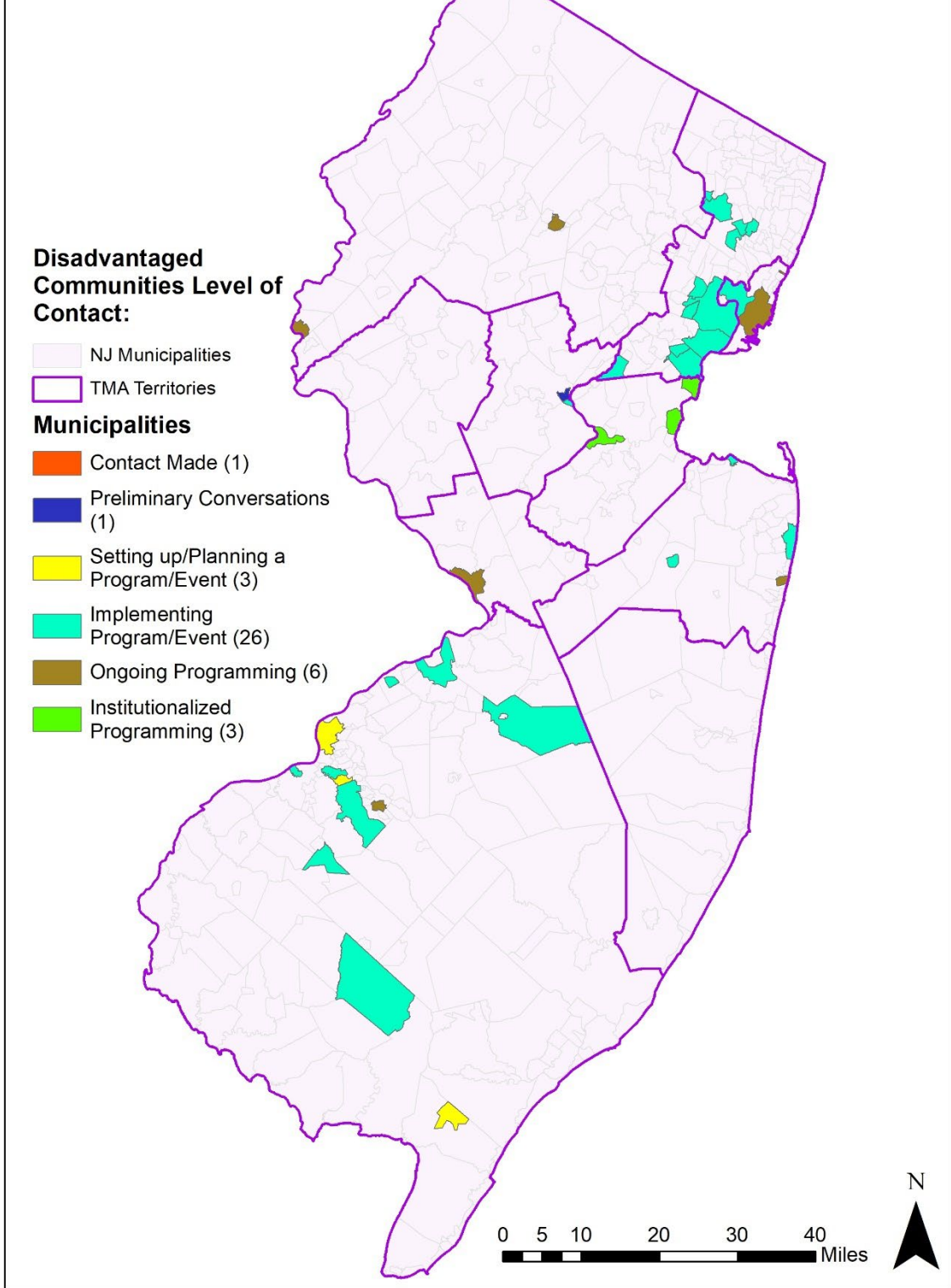

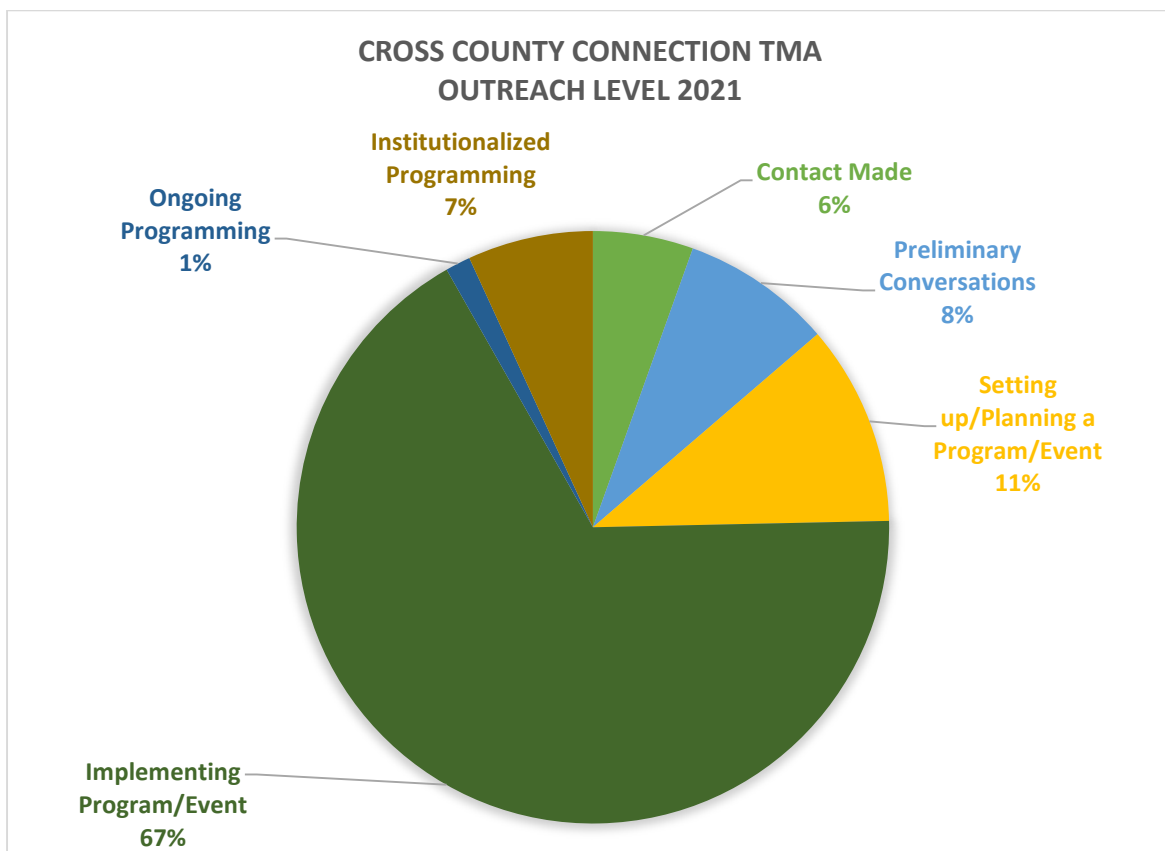

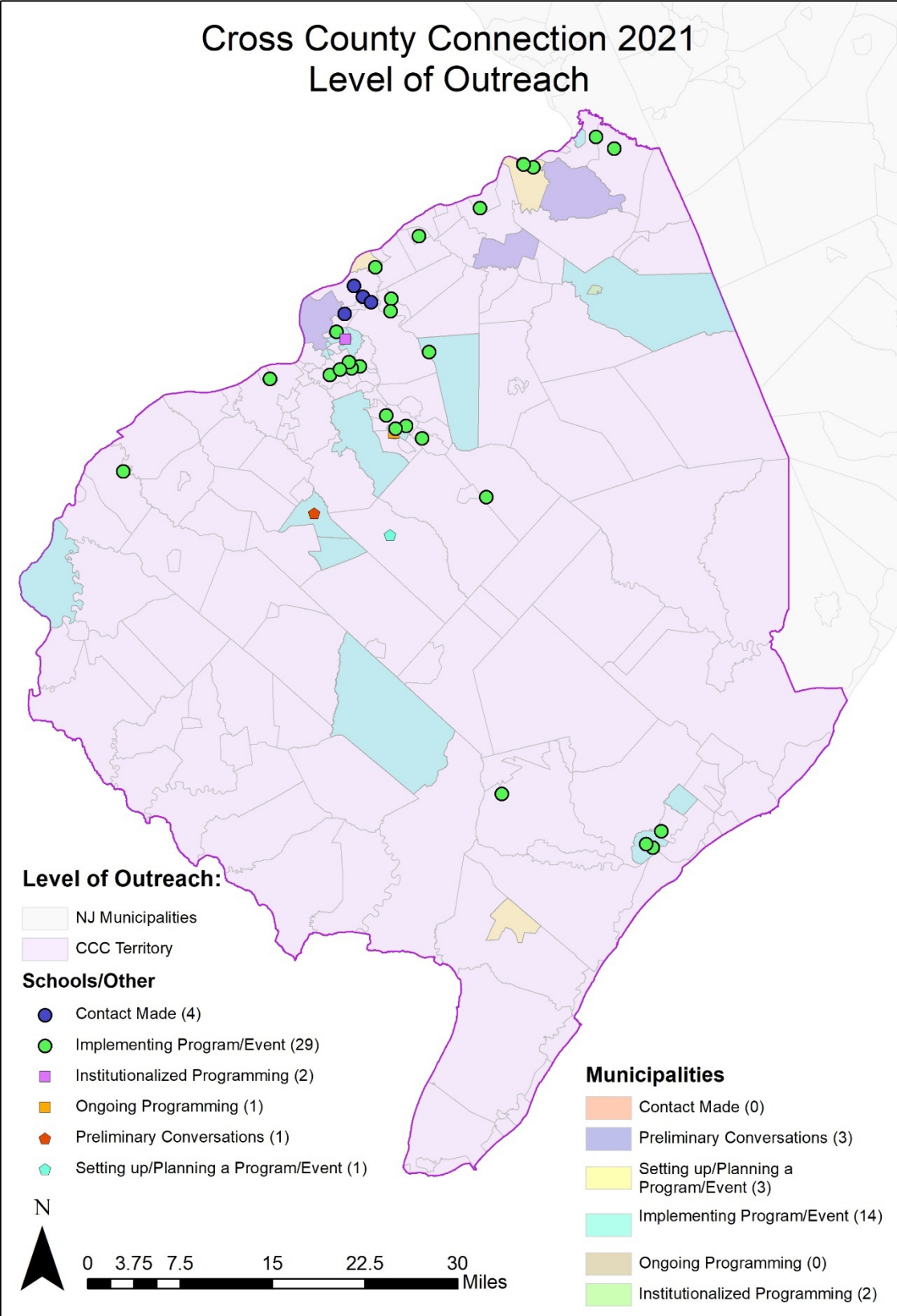

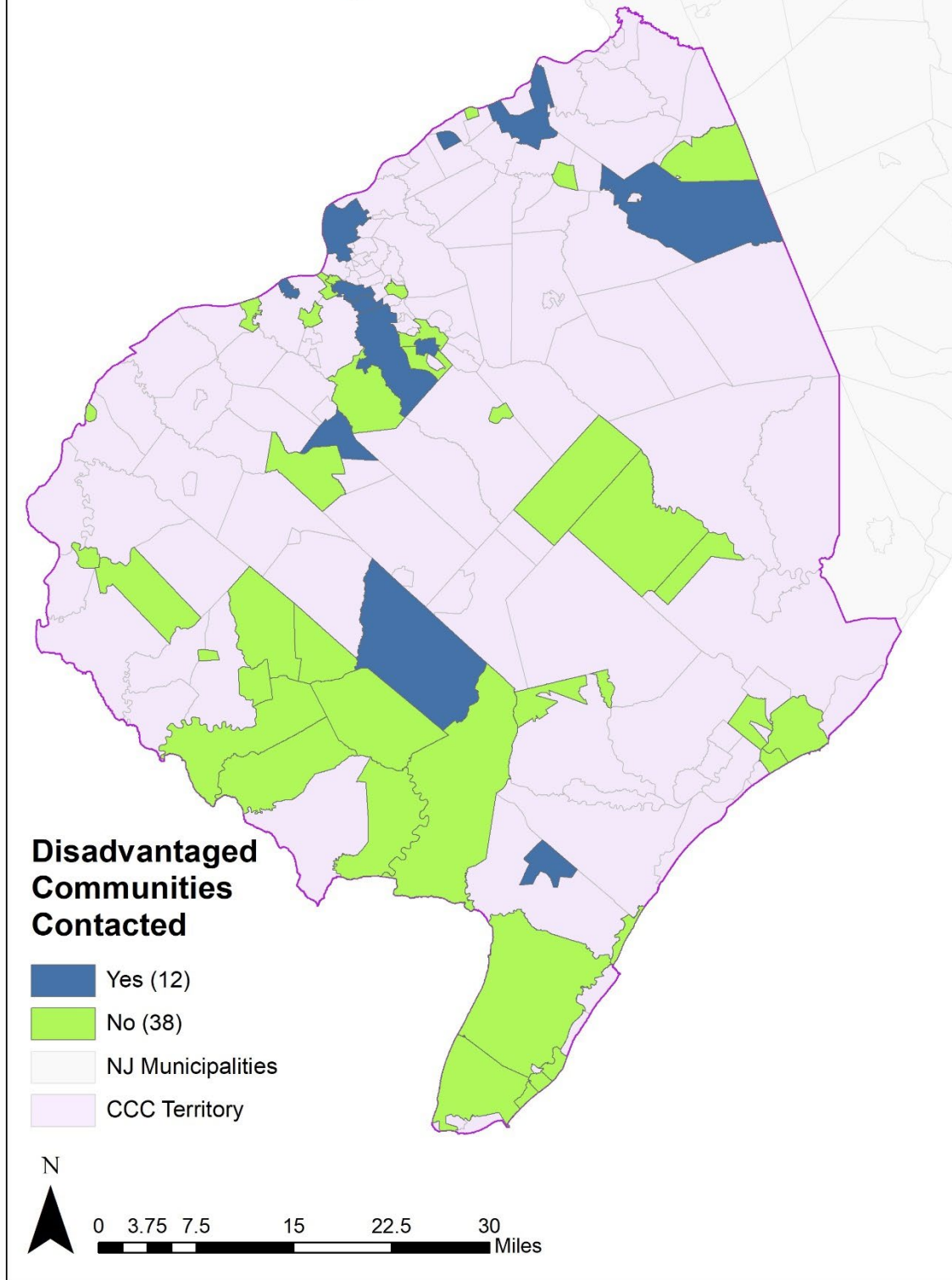

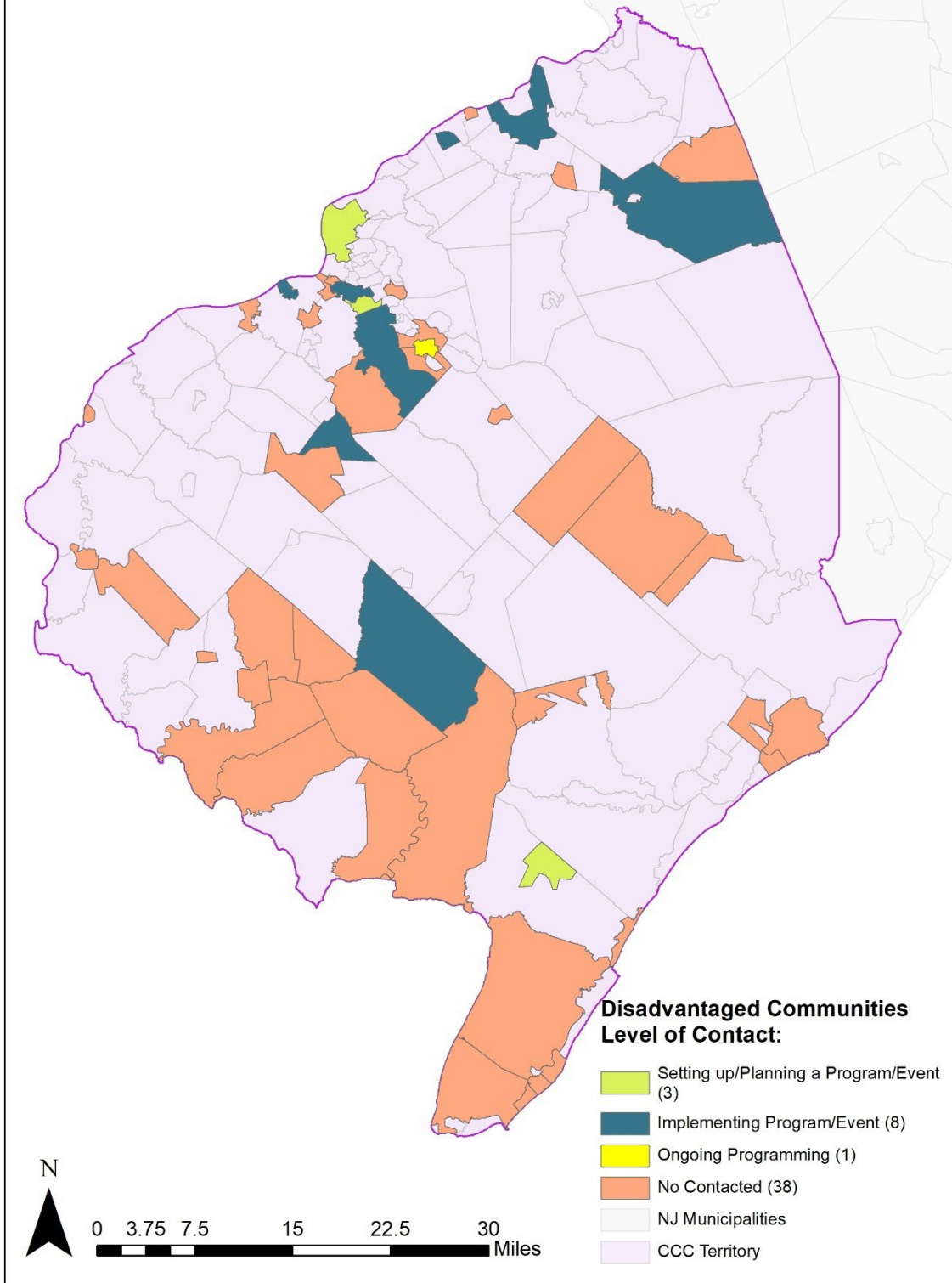
Cross County Connection 2021 Level of Outreach

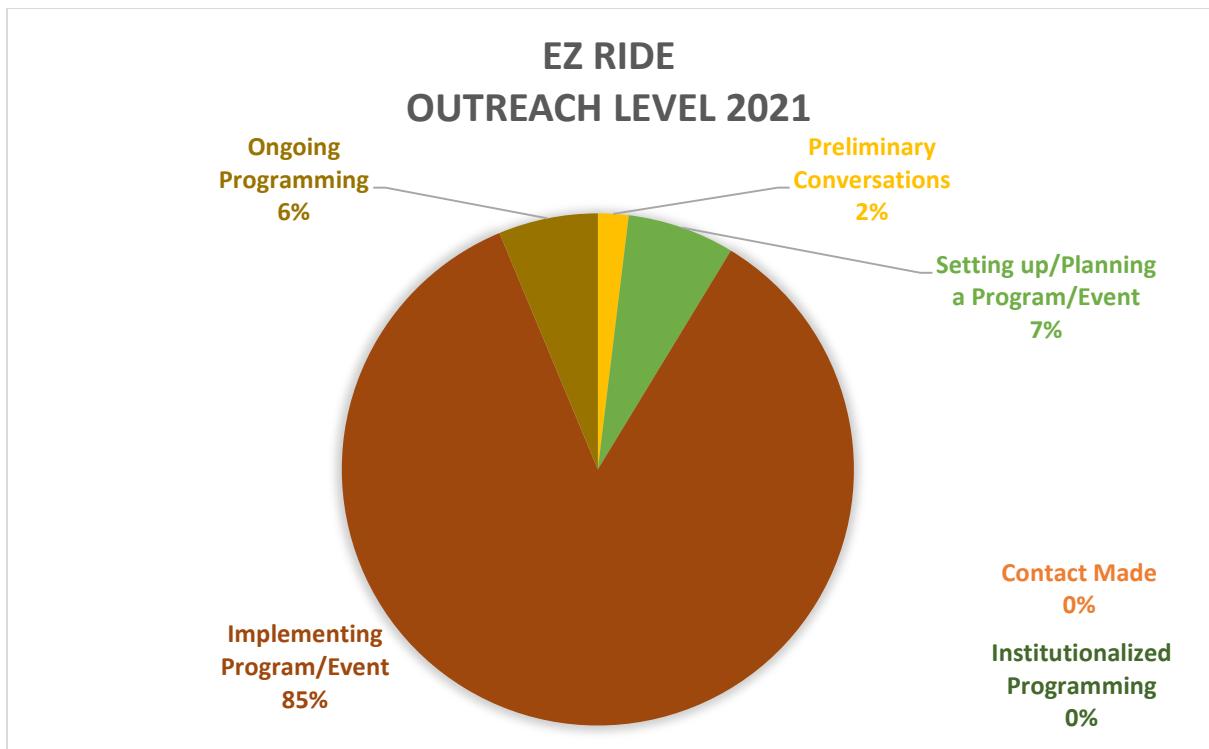

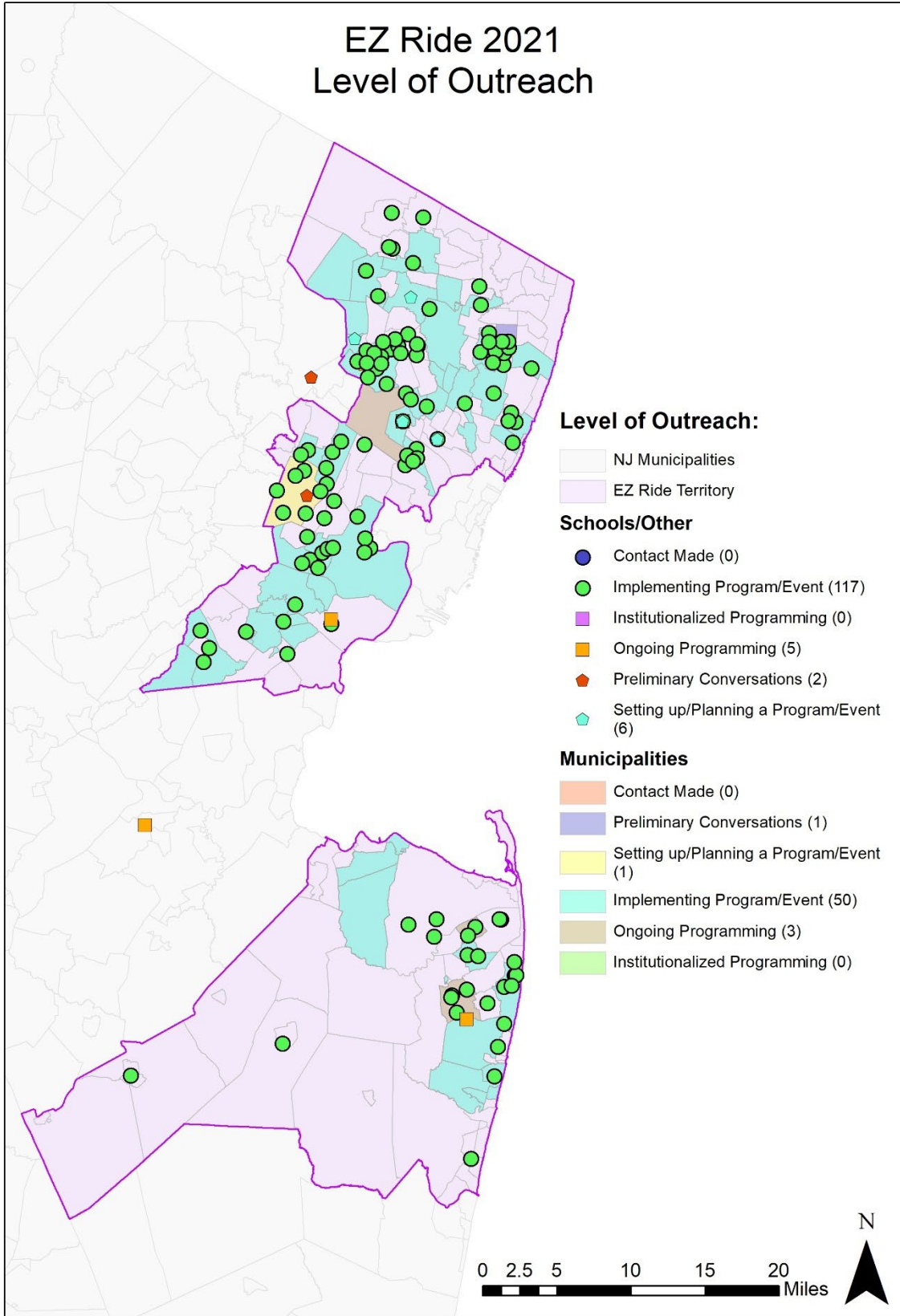

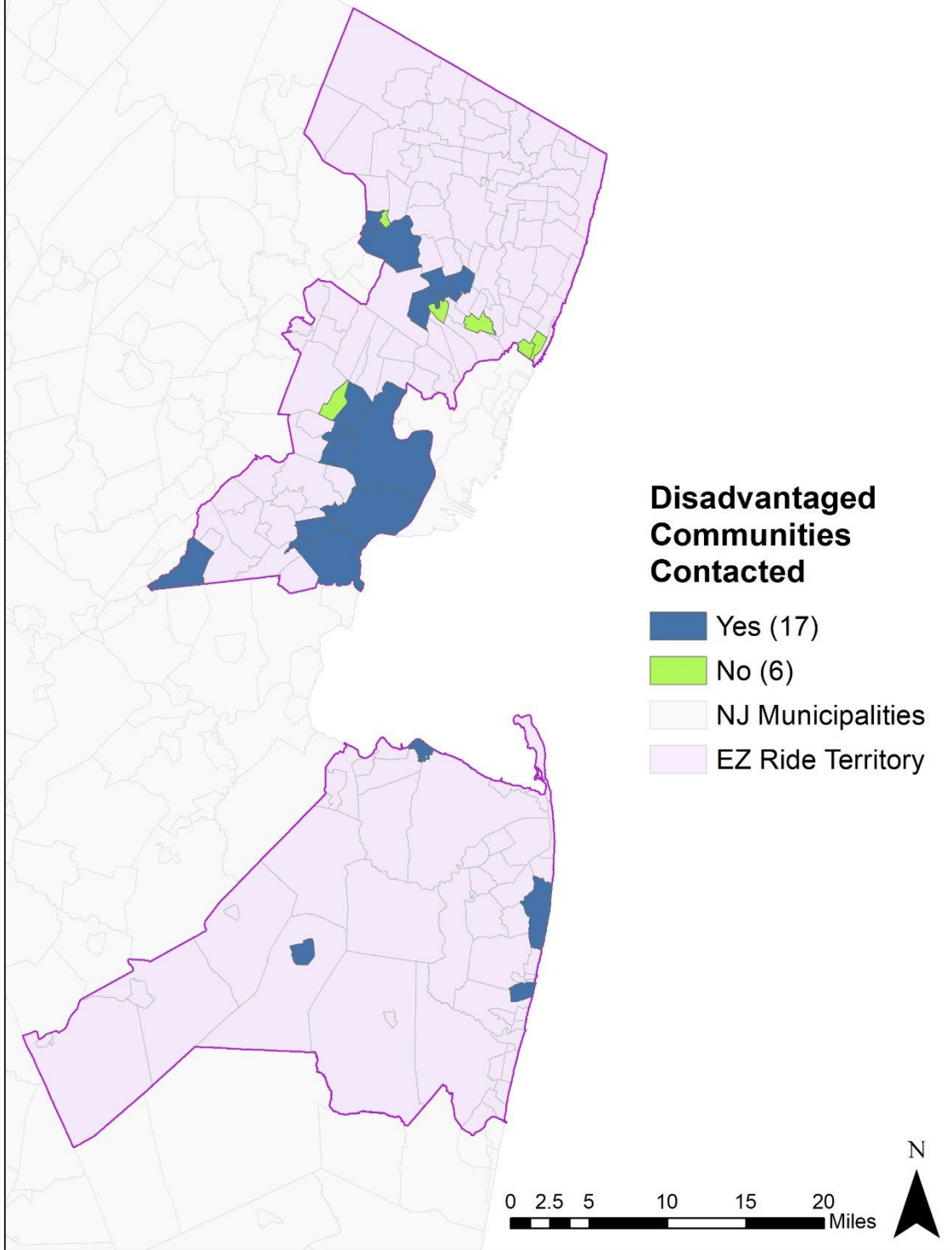

EZ Ride 2021 Level of Outreach

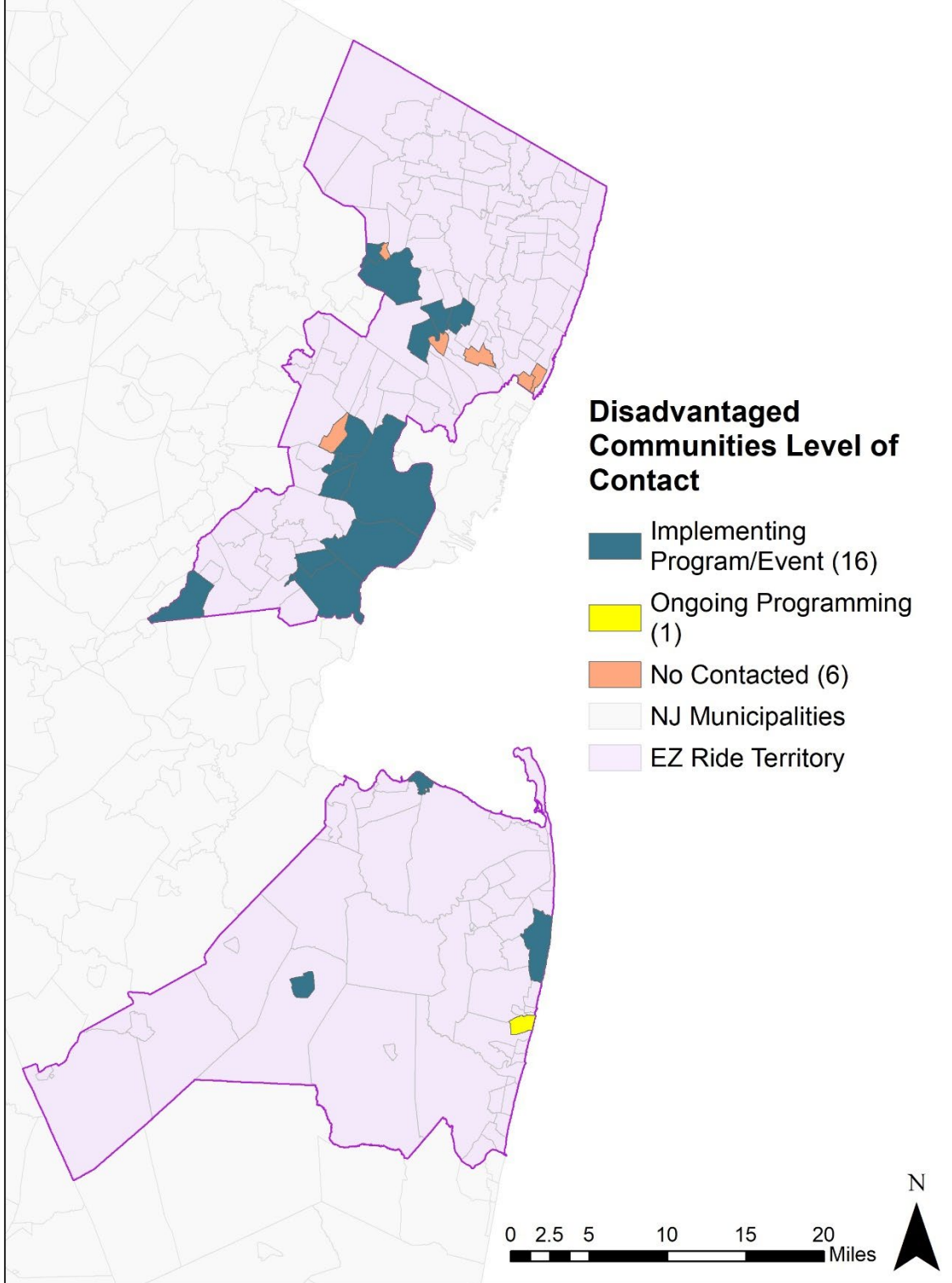


EZ Ride 2021 Disadvantaged Communities Outreach

Disadvantaged Communities Level of Contact



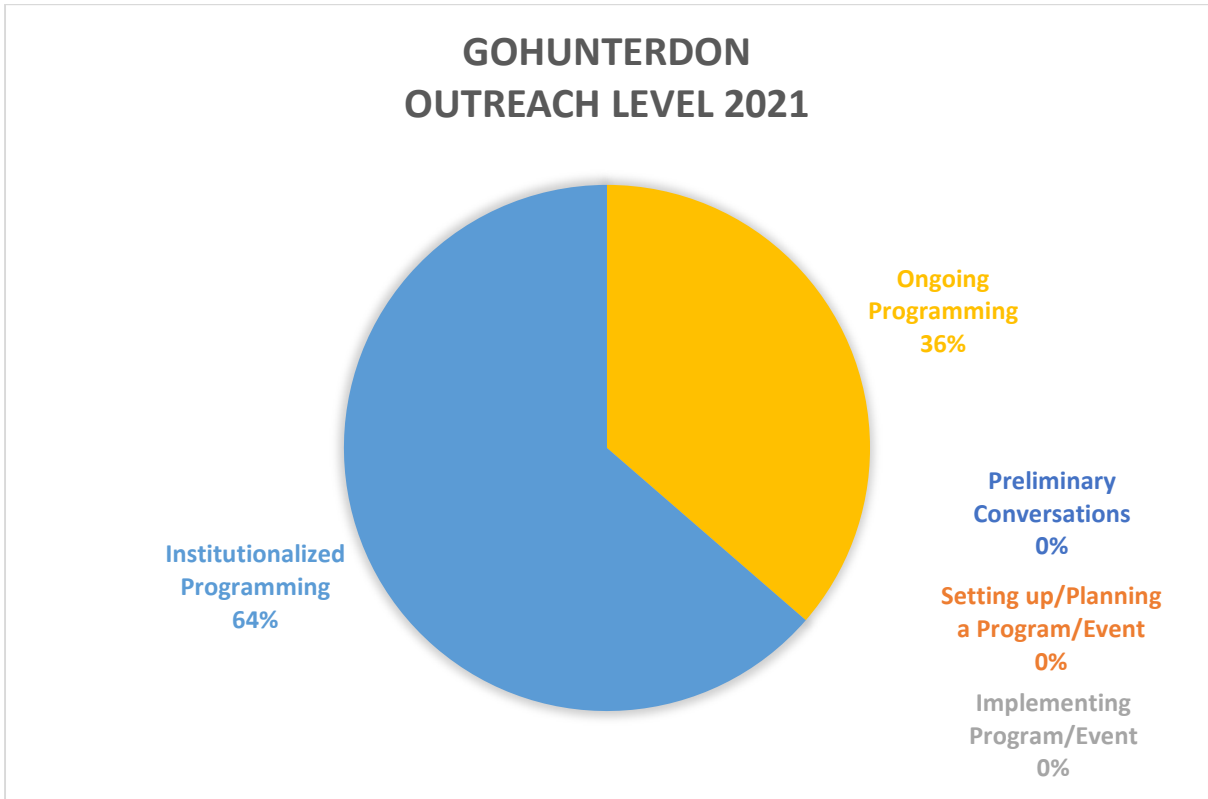

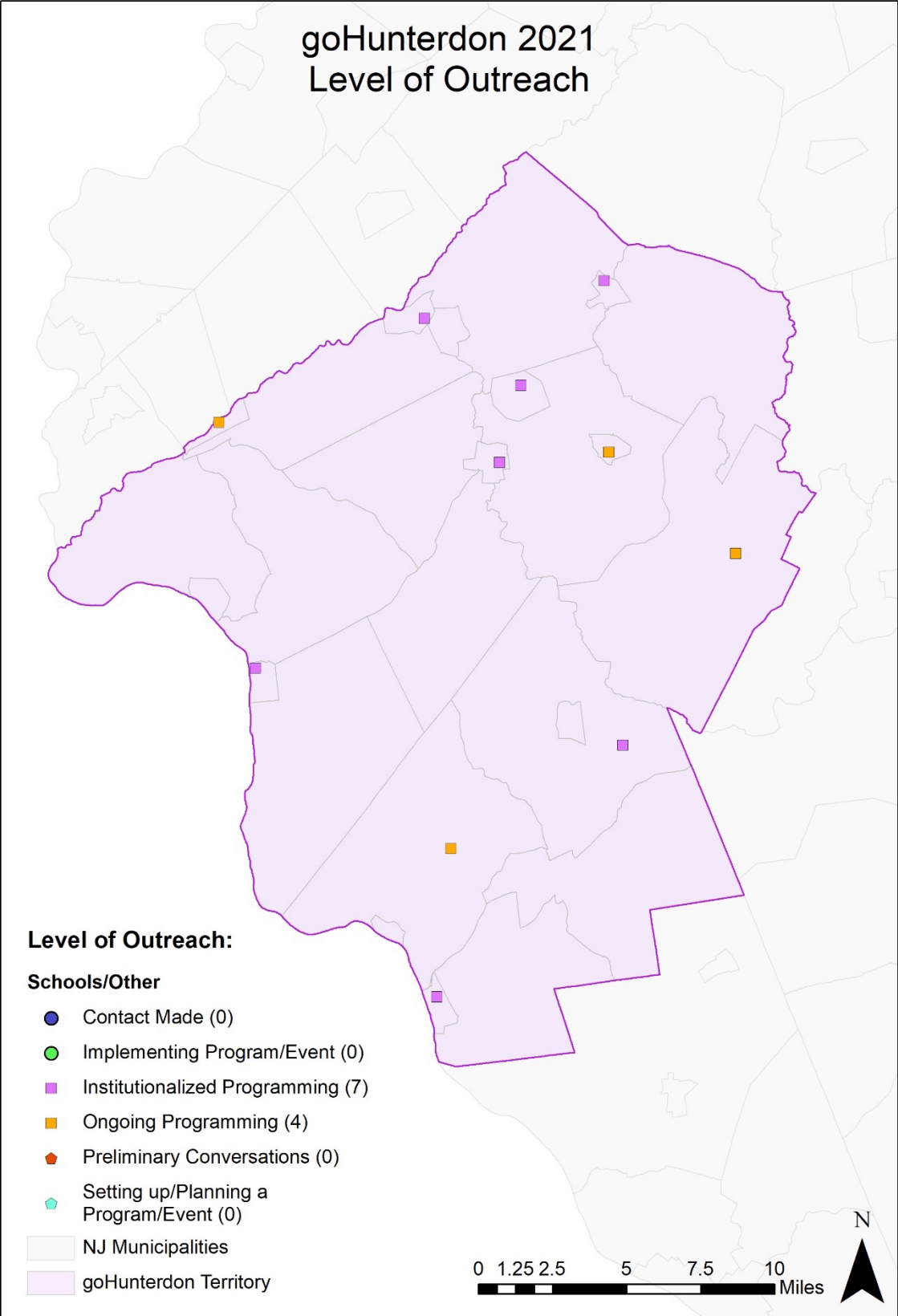

goHunterdon 2021 Level of Outreach



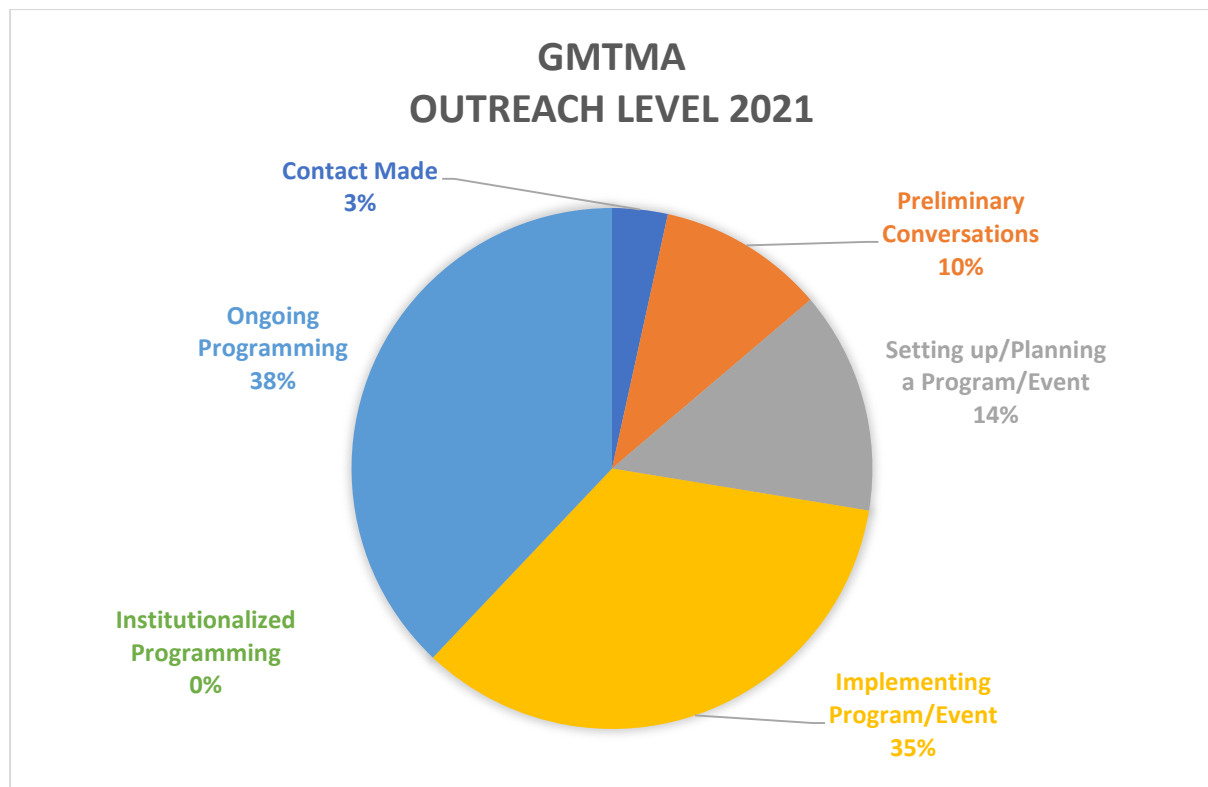

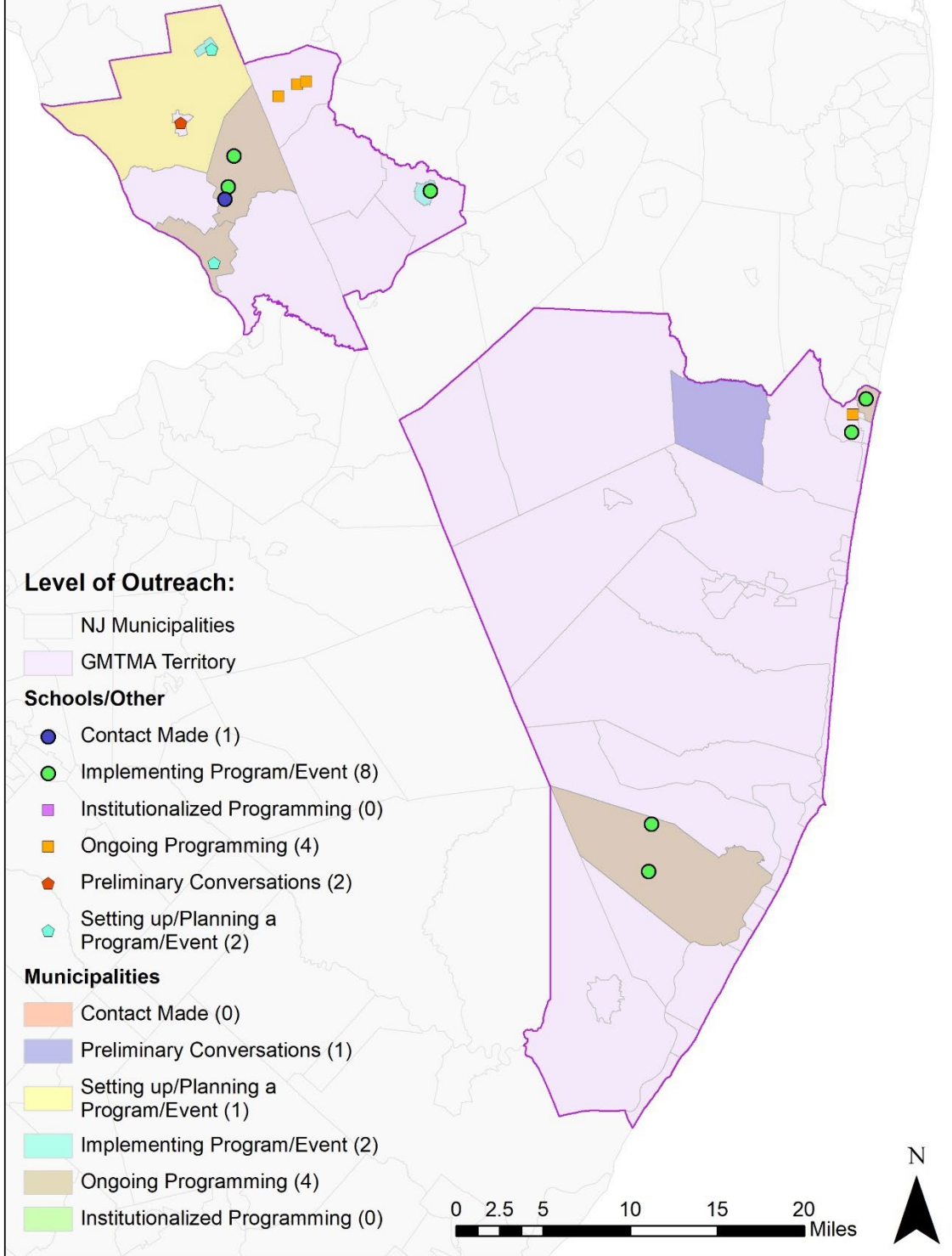

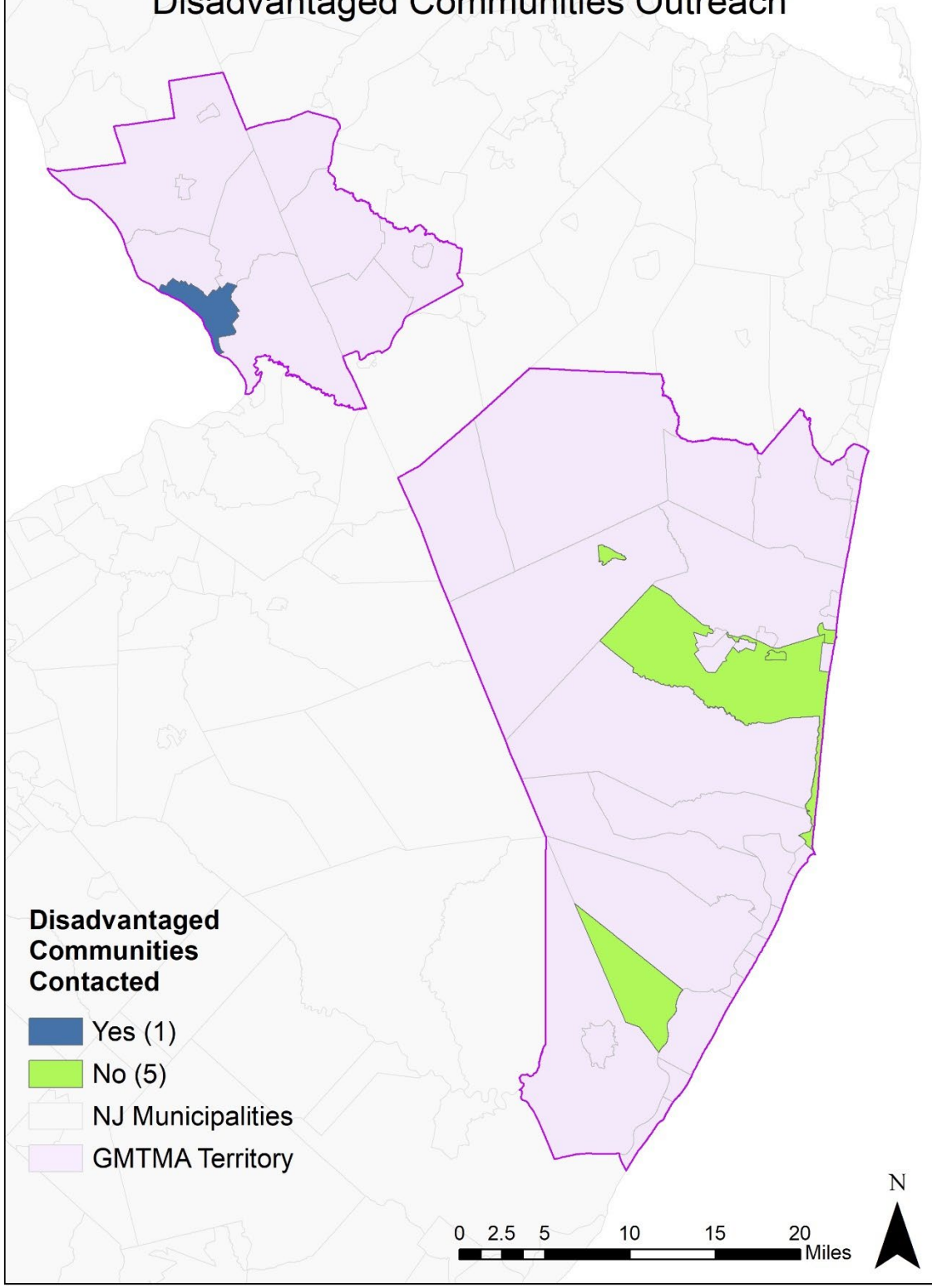

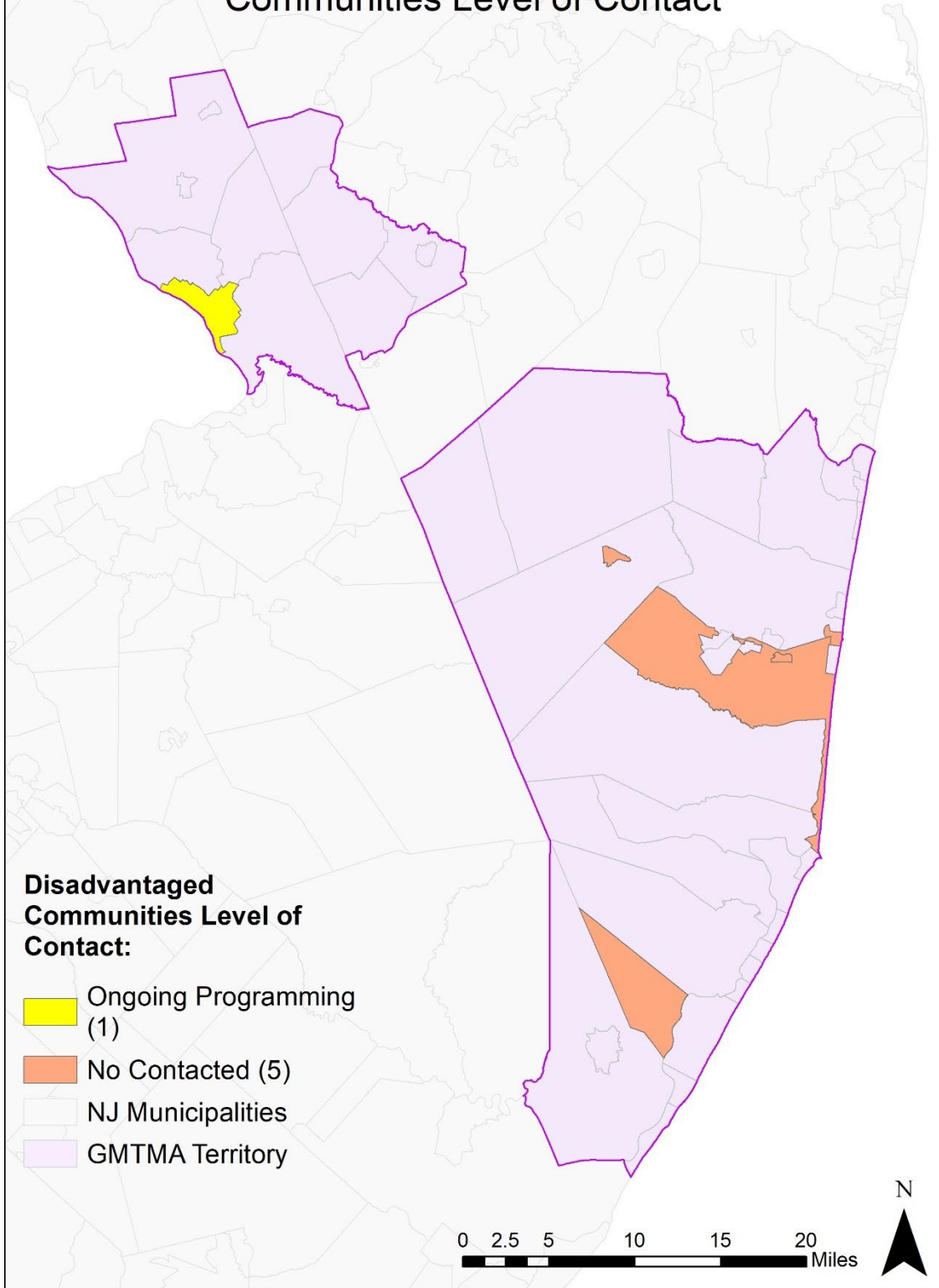
Greater Mercer 2021 Level of Outreach

Greater Mercer 2021 Disadvantaged Communities Level of Contact



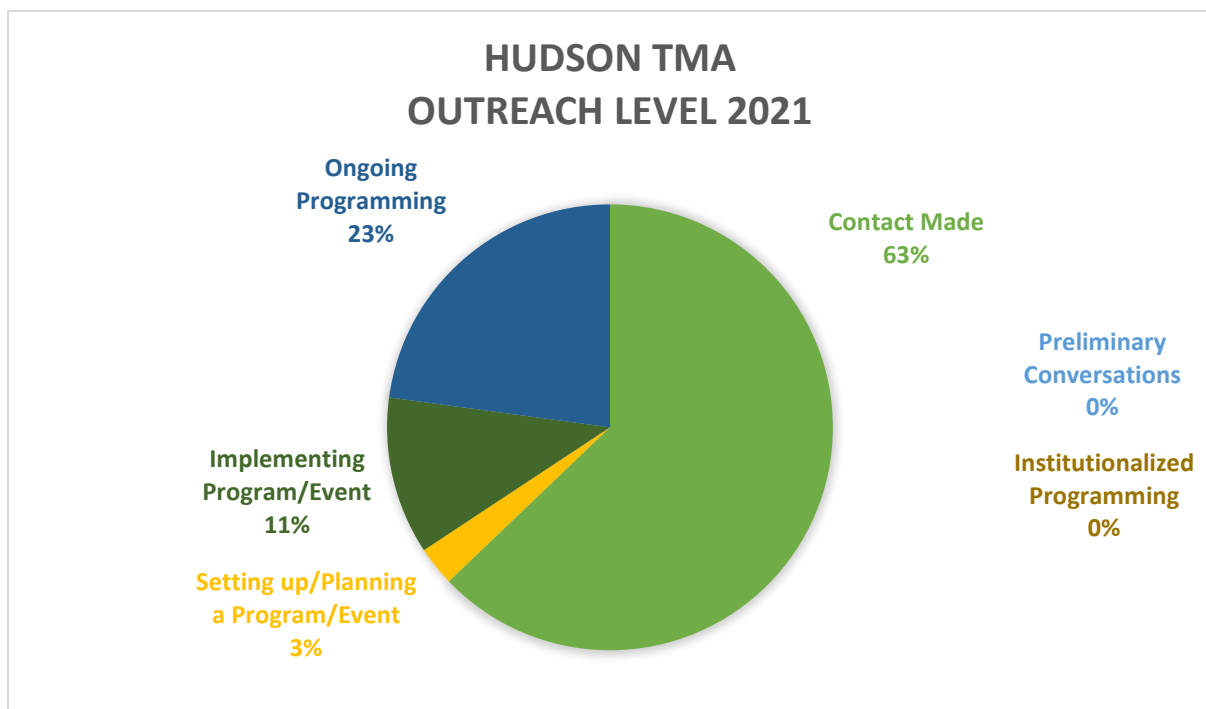

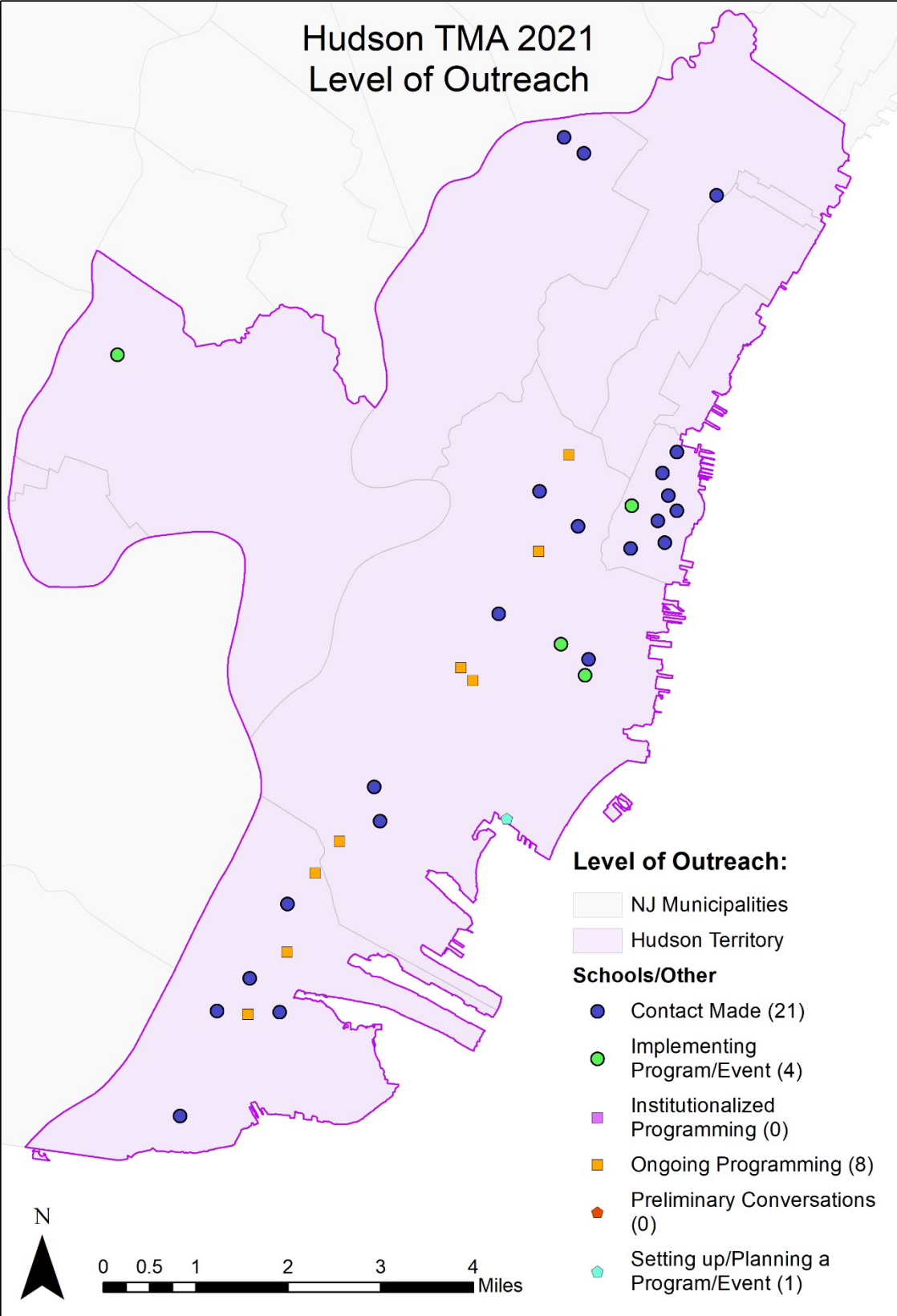

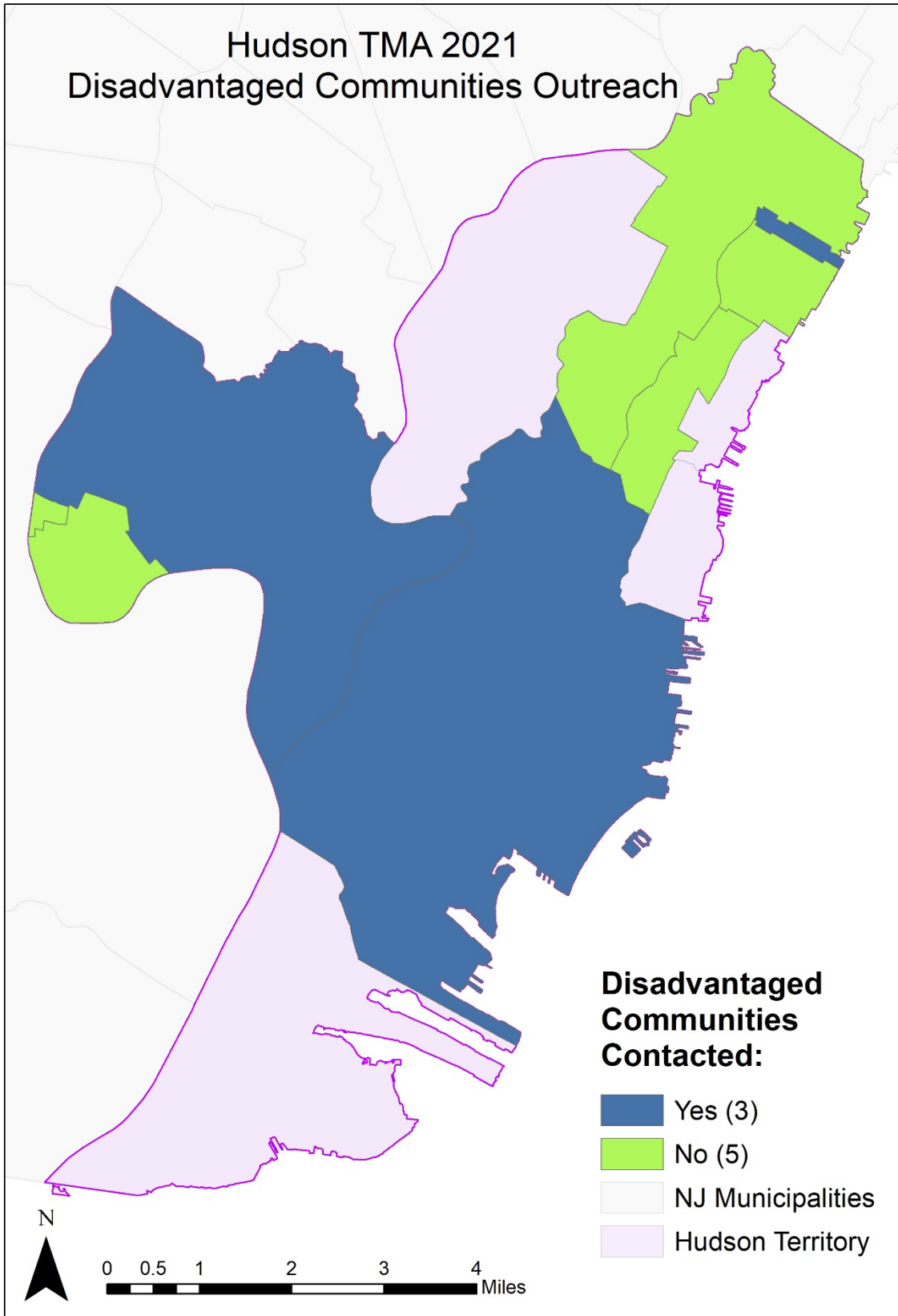

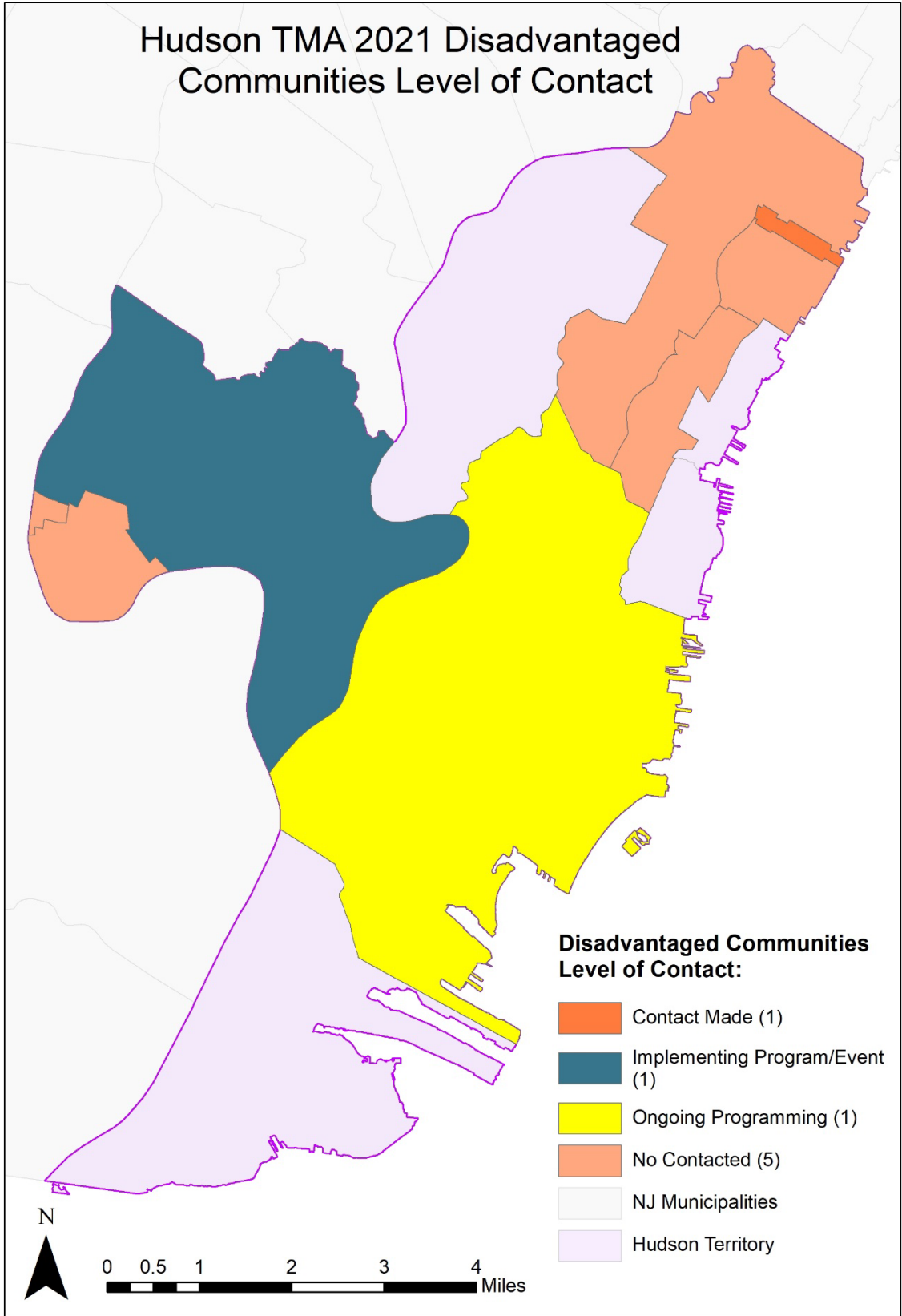
Hudson TMA 2021 Level of Outreach

Hudson TMA 2021 Disadvantaged Communities Level of Contact



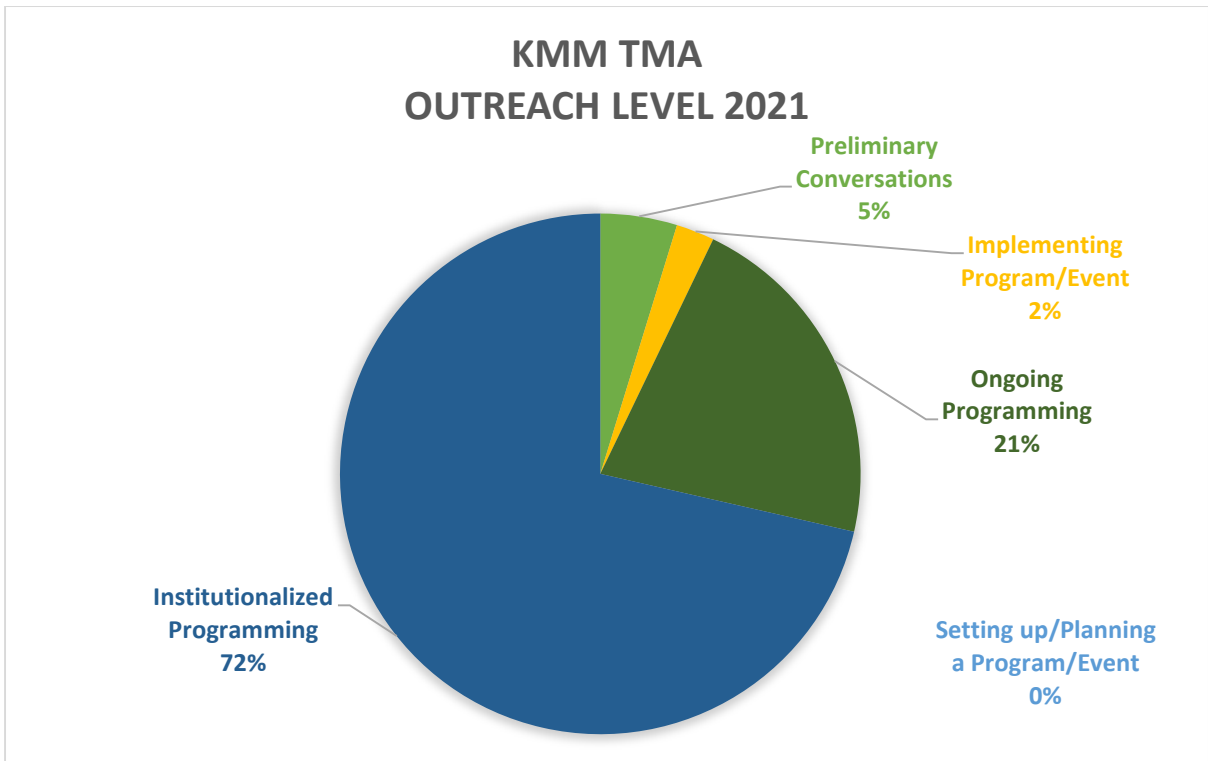

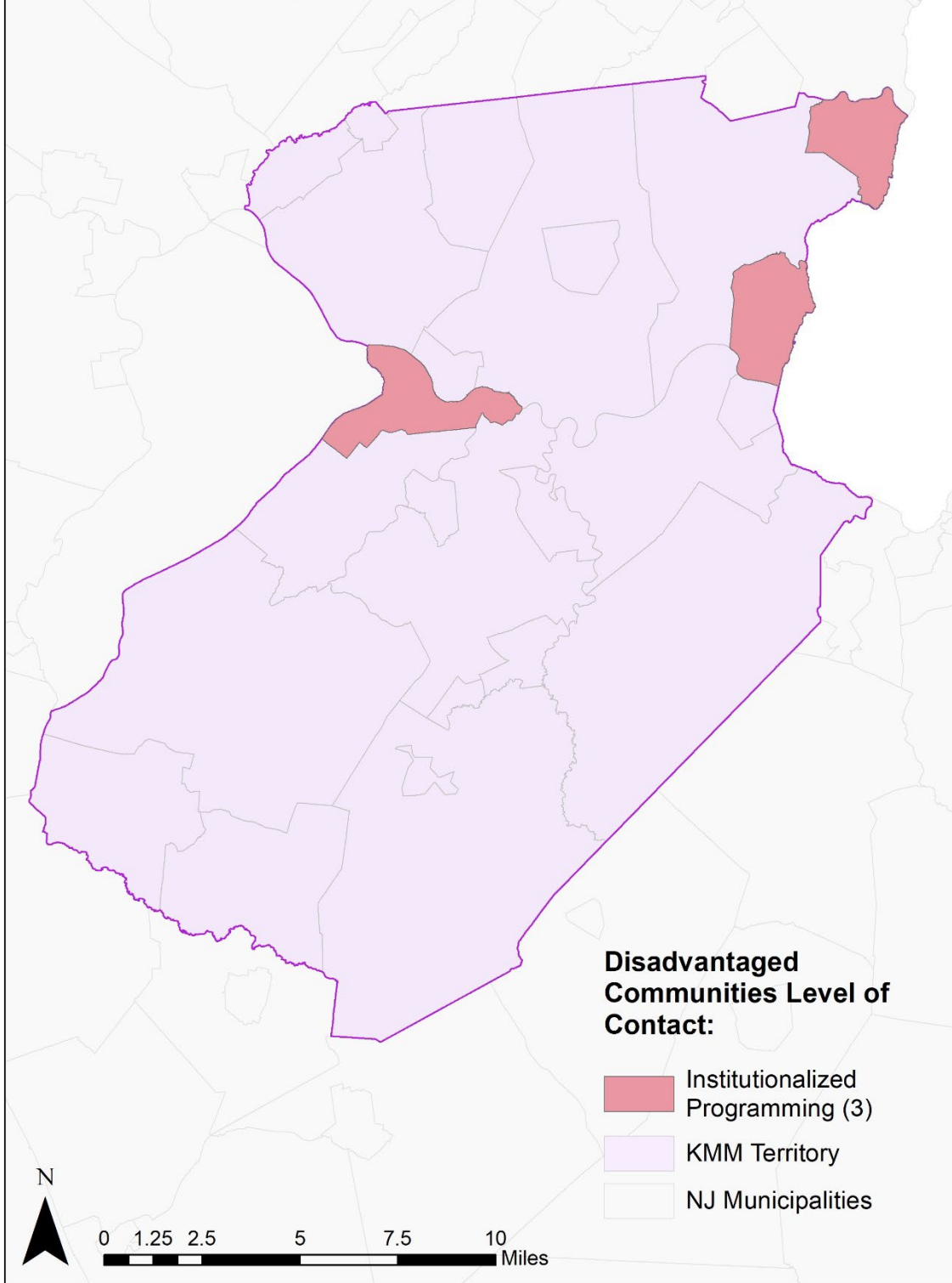
Keep Middlesex Moving 2021 Level of Outreach

Keep Middlesex Moving 2021 Disadvantaged Communities Level of Contact



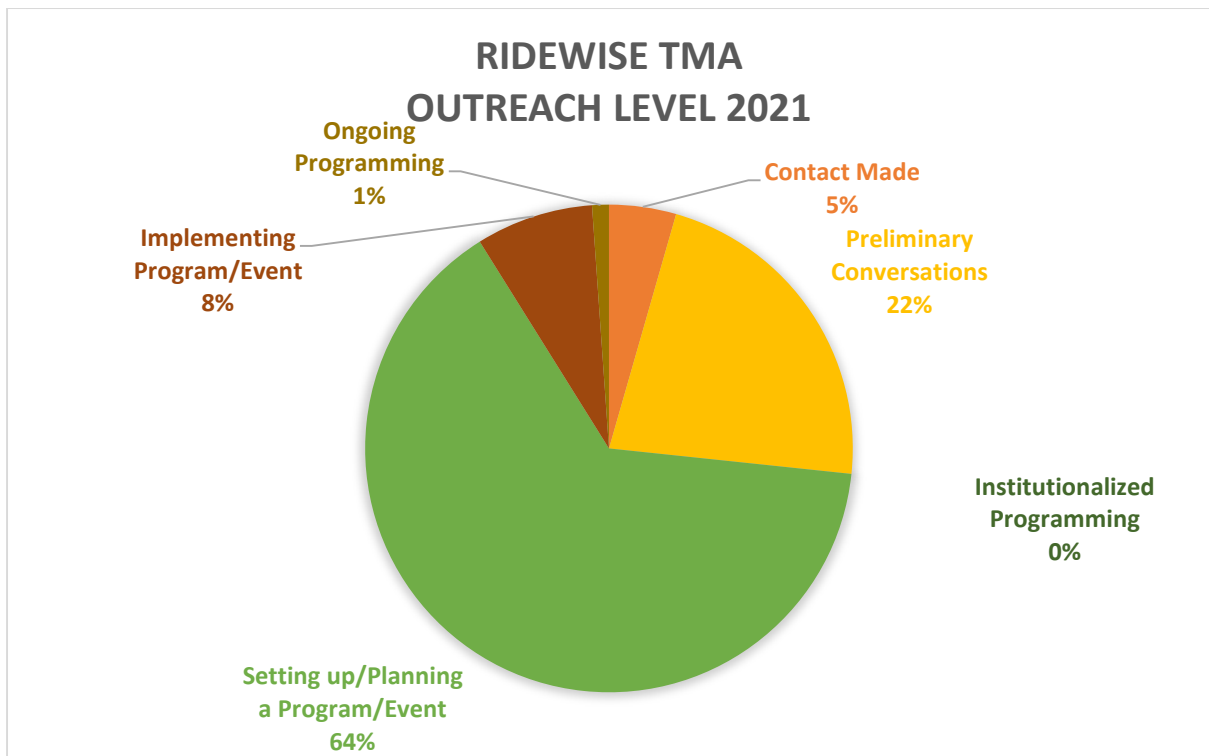

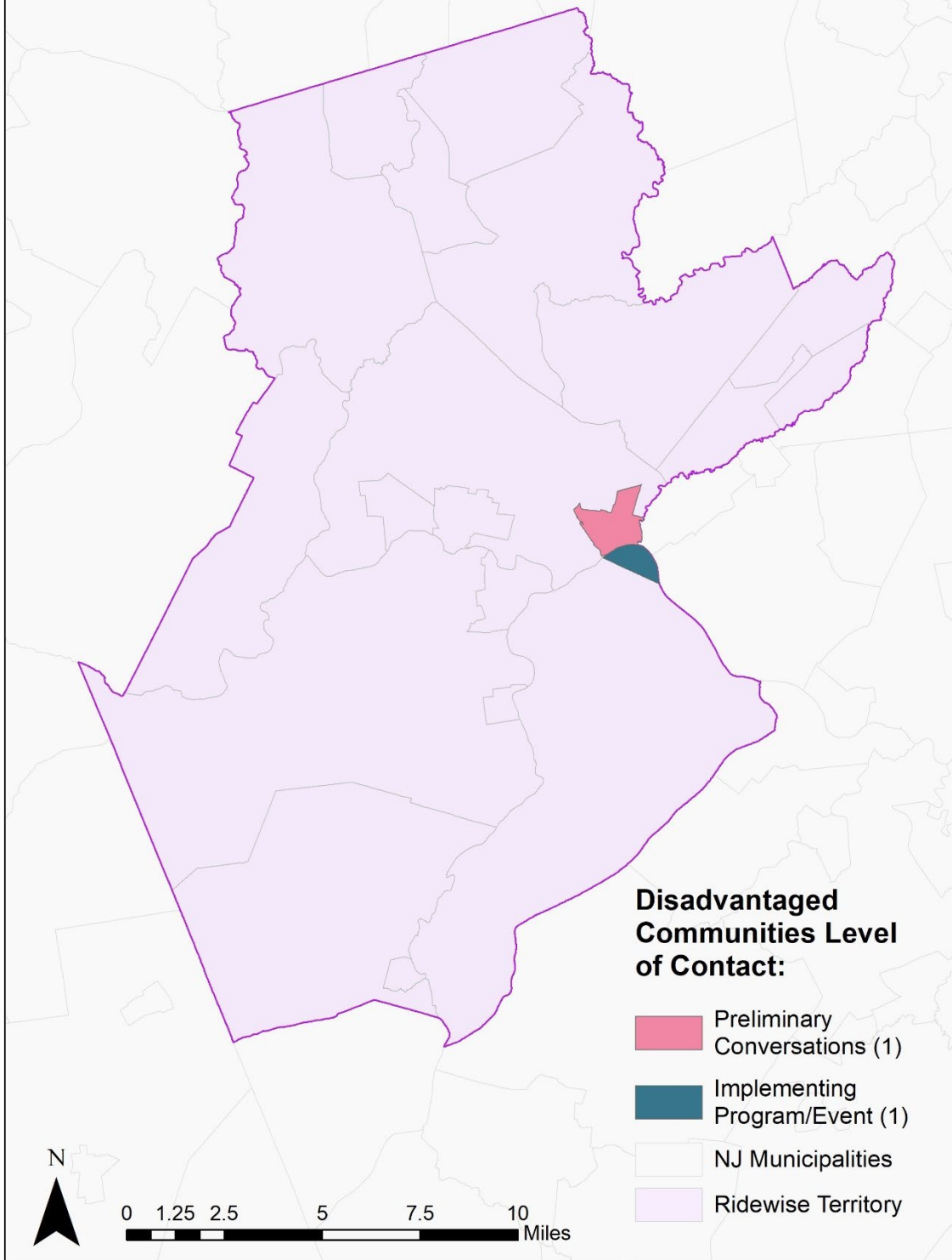
RideWise 2021 Level of Outreach

RideWise 2021 Disadvantaged Communities Level of Contact



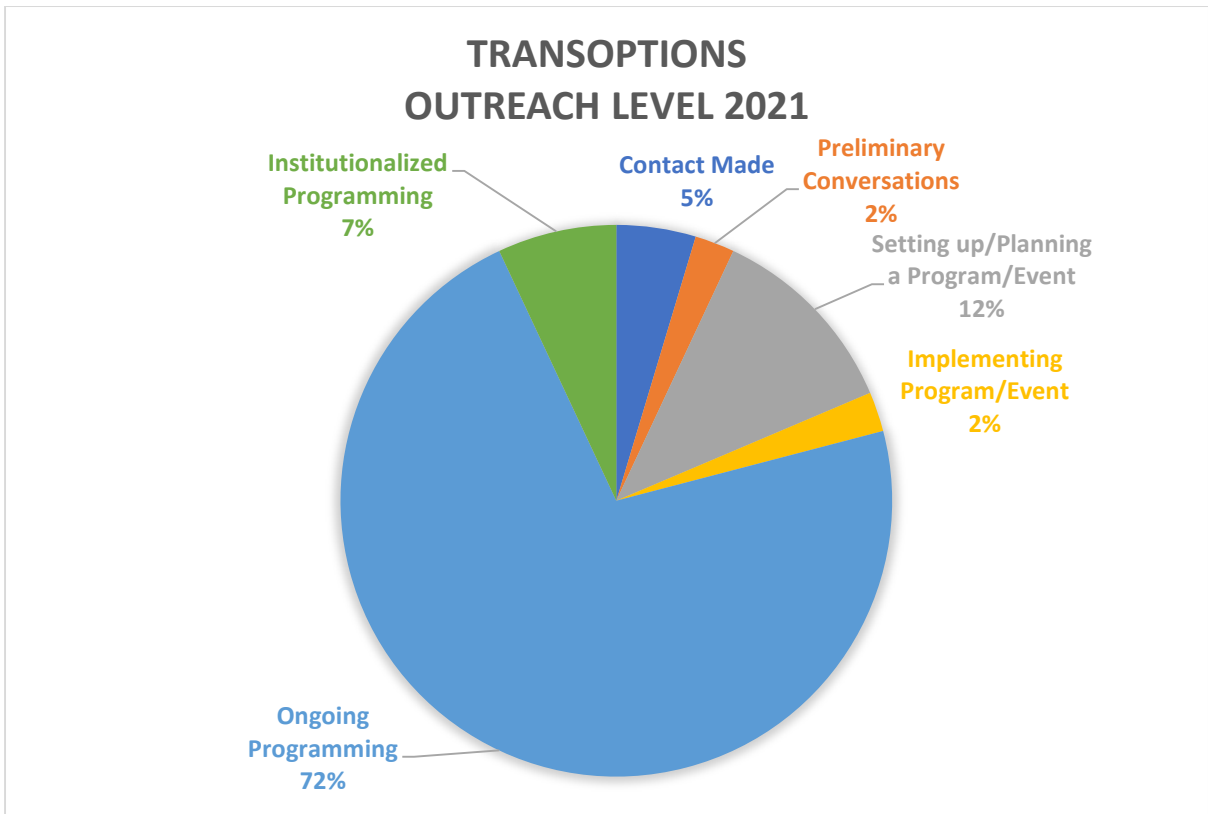

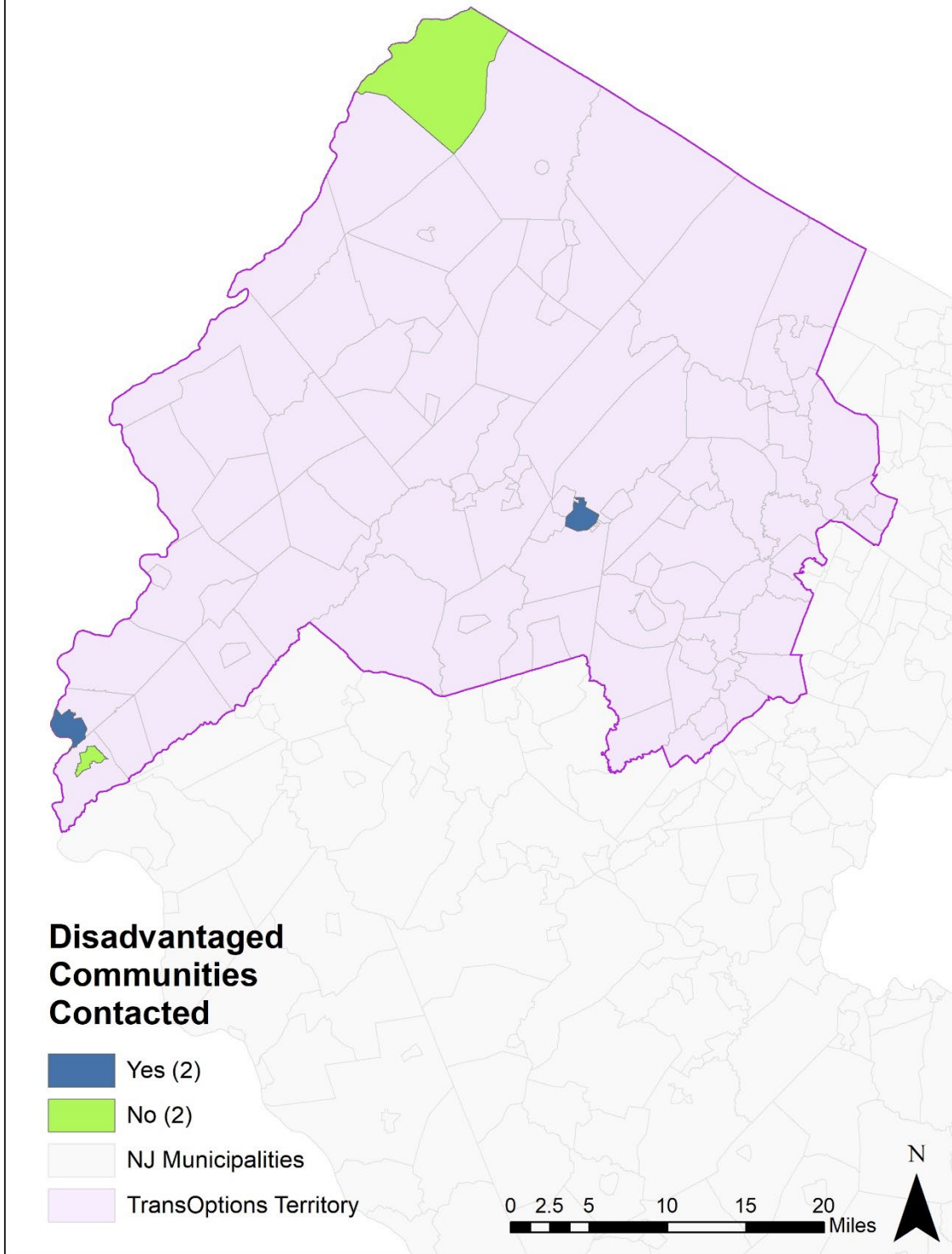

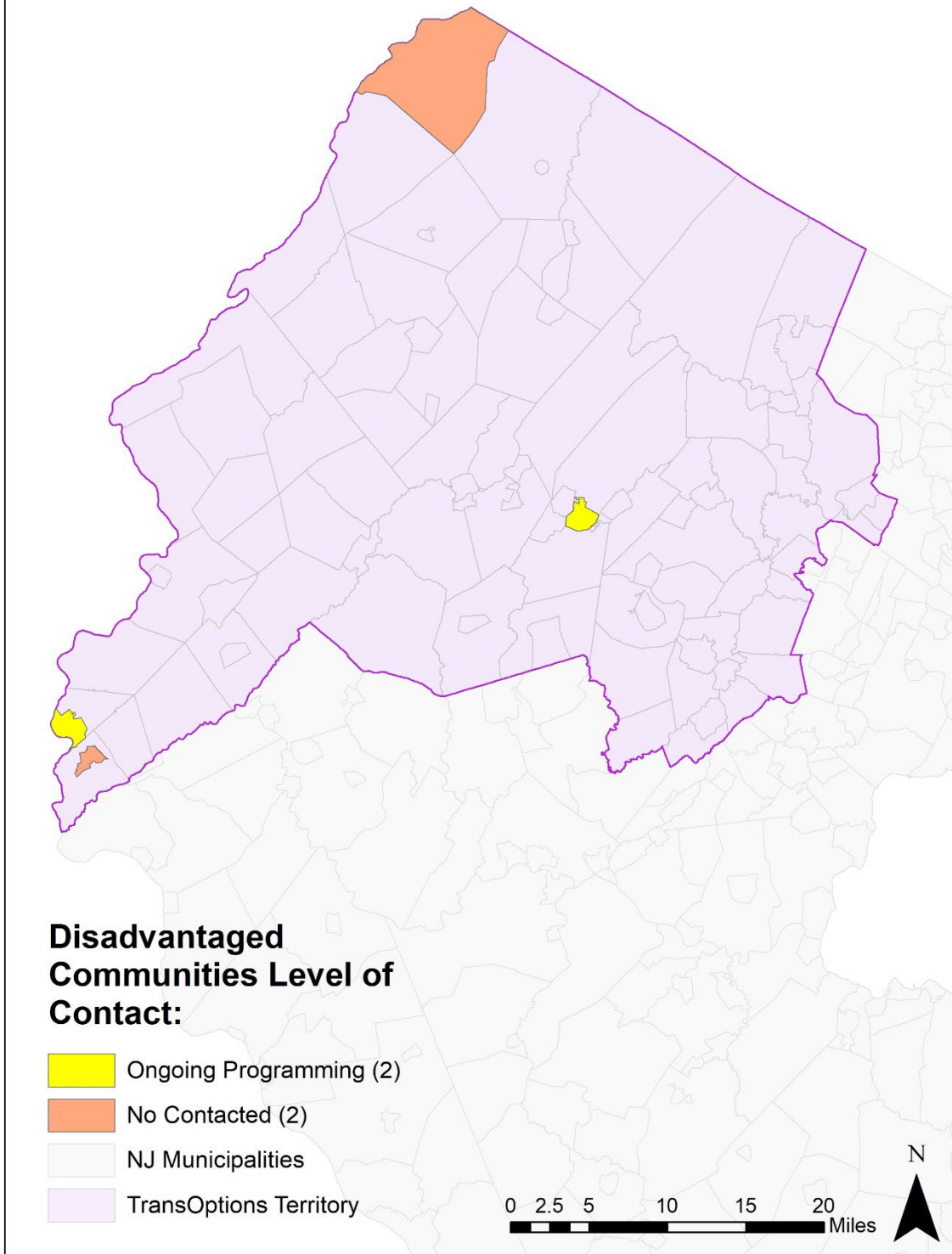
TransOptions 2021 Level of Outreach

2. Training

The NJ Safe Routes Resource Center develops, coordinates, and facilitates training programs for SRTS Regional Coordinators to foster the use of best practices throughout New Jersey. These training opportunities offered throughout the year help to ensure that TMA SRTS Regional Coordinators are well-informed about SRTS programming and to establish consistency throughout the State. Interactive trainings, whether held in-person or virtually, offer opportunities for the TMA SRTS Regional Coordinators to share their experiences and learn from one another through discussions to explore barriers and opportunities to SRTS program expansion, how to overcome the barriers, and how to leverage the opportunities. Below is a description of trainings developed based on priorities set by NJDOT that were coordinated throughout 2021.

- **Sustainable Jersey and SRTS Training**
Staff worked with representatives from Sustainable Jersey to develop training for TMA SRTS staff regarding two new Sustainable Jersey actions related to Safe Routes to School, Complete and Green Streets for All and Bicycle and/or Pedestrian Improvement Projects. Training highlighted requirements, how these requirements aligned with NJDOT best practices, and how the Sustainable Jersey and Safe Routes to School programs coordinate for mutual benefit.
- **NJDOT Review Process**
As part of this training, TMA SRTS staff was walked through a guidance document developed by VTC to outline the NJDOT Review Process. The document, and resulting training, specifies which SRTS related work needs NJDOT review and approval, in which situations NJDOT and FHWA funding must be referenced, and specifically how NJDOT and FHWA funding should be referenced.
- **Equity Emphasis Areas and the Equity Emphasis Areas Mapping Tool**
To provide a more inclusive and modern definition, the decision was made to move on from the traditional “disadvantaged communities” and to instead focus on Equity Emphasis Areas defined by the 2021 NJ Department of Community Affairs Targeted Urban Municipalities List and the NJ Department of Environmental Protection Overburdened Communities list. To better visualize the Equity Emphasis Areas, a training was held to familiarize TMA SRTS staff with the newly developed Equity Emphasis Area Map, an easy-to-use web-based tool.
- **Safe Routes to School Grant Training for TMAs**
This training was coordinated to provide the TMA SRTS Coordinators with information about the SRTS grants so that they could more effectively work with partners in their service areas applying for funding. Training included an overview of the programs, information regarding technical assistance resources, and tips and strategies for developing effective grants.
- **New SRTS Coordinator Orientation and Training (2)**
AS TMA SRTS staff changes and expands, it’s important to make sure that new staff members have the tools and knowledge necessary to coordinate SRTS programs in their service area. The trainings covered the organization of SRTS in New Jersey and the roles of various players; meetings, records of contact, and quarterly reports; SRTS electronic resources; and key points and resource review of important SRTS training materials. All new TMA staff who attended trainings were provided with a flash drive containing key training presentations and resources that have been developed throughout the life of the NJ SRTS program.

3. Performance Measures

The 2012 NJ SRTS Strategic Plan Update identified a mission and vision for the program as well as goals and performance measures to reflect the growth and success of the program.

The NJ SRTS goals include:

- **Goal 1:** Educate and encourage students, parents, community members, schools, enforcement agencies, and municipalities to enhance their knowledge of safe walking and bicycling practices, increase the level-of-comfort with walking and bicycling to school, and improve the rates of walking and bicycling to school.
- **Goal 2:** Improve the health of school populations, communities, and the environment.
- **Goal 3:** Nurture strong partnerships and empower a network of leaders around the state to advocate for actions and policies that encourage SRTS.
- **Goal 4:** Promote and implement engineering strategies to support the SRTS program.
- **Goal 5:** Create and provide state-of-the-art tools, resources, and research to further SRTS.
- **Goal 6:** Sustain the SRTS program into the future, even in the face of uncertain funding.
- **Goal 7:** Monitor and evaluate the SRTS program's reach and effectiveness.

A total of 52 performance measures for these Goals were identified. Sources for this data include Transportation Management Associations, the New Jersey Bicycle and Pedestrian Resource Center, Sustainable Jersey, NJDOT, and VTC. VTC organized the performance measures into four categories:

- (1) Those measures currently monitored;
- (2) Measures requiring minimal additional effort to gather information;
- (3) Measures that would be assessed through a short term project; and
- (4) Measures requiring development of a new study.

For this update report, four performance measures of those currently monitored were tabulated and reported on the spreadsheet for 2021 to reflect the integration of SRTS and related goals in municipalities across NJ as indicated in the sheet. NJ SRTS Recognition Program recipients, both schools and municipalities that have attained Gold, Silver and Bronze status are also reflected on page 64. School Travel Plans that have been reviewed and approved by NJDOT are reflected on page 68. School Travel Plans completed within five years are considered current; those older than five years are no longer current and must be updated.

Conclusion

The year 2020 brought the state, nation, and the world unprecedented challenges. While the world began opening up and students began returning to classrooms, the COVID-19 pandemic continued to impact everyday life throughout 2021. This update report is a testament the dedication of the NJ Safe Routes Program to meeting these challenges, and continuing to thrive. The Safe Routes non-infrastructure program has adapted by developing new resources and leveraging innovative technology in creative ways, always with the goal of keeping New Jersey's youth safe, active and healthy.

Though faced with difficulty, the NJ Safe Routes to School non-infrastructure program continued to grow throughout 2021. Programming continued throughout the State as TMA SRTS Coordinators modified programs, conducted lessons virtually, or focused on outdoor learning with their local partners. During 2021, programming was conducted with and TMA staff coordinated with 205 communities throughout New Jersey. Looking at Performance Measures as of December 2021, there were: 120 completed school travel plans, 172 Complete Streets Policies adopted, 57 completed SRTS Actions for Sustainable Jersey, 21 completed Complete Streets actions for Sustainable Jersey (newer, more challenging Action using NJDOT best practices), and 131 SRTS Infrastructure grants awarded.

Though significant progress has been made and the program continued throughout the ongoing pandemic, ongoing challenges remain and there is still much to be done. SRTS Regional Coordinators at each TMA will continue to promote and implement an expanding variety of SRTS programs in their service areas guided by training, oversight, and technical assistance informed by continued research from the NJ Safe Routes Resource Center. Using national best practice research and relying on the lessons learned through past success, the New Jersey SRTS Program will continue to grow as we seek to reach out to and partner with additional schools, local and regional governments, and other organizations to provide SRTS programs and services, ensuring that inclusion of equity emphasis areas remains a core program priority.
